**EX PARTE ORDER APPROVING  
PLANTE & MORAN'S PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT**

PRESENT: HONRABLE JAMES S. JAMO, CIRCUIT COURT JUDGE

WHEREAS, James Gerber, as duly appointed Special Deputy Liquidator (the  
"Special Deputy Liquidator") of Consumers Mutual Insurance of Michigan

(Consumers Mutual”), has filed an *Ex Parte* Petition for Approval of Plante & Moran Professional Services Agreement (the “Ex Parte Petition”); and

WHEREAS, the *Ex Parte* Petition seeks the Court’s approval of compensation to be paid to Plante & Moran, PLLC (“Plante & Moran”) to review and analyze additional information provided by Cofinity, KBA, MultiPlan and/or Consumers Mutual related to the June 22, 2018 report by Plante & Moran; and

WHEREAS, MCL 500.8121(1)(b) and (c) authorize the Liquidator to employ accountants and other personnel as he considers necessary to assist in the Consumers Mutual liquidation proceeding, and to fix the reasonable compensation to be paid to such accountants and other personnel with the Court’s approval; and

WHEREAS, the Liquidator has determined that the review and analysis of additional information provided by Cofinity, KBA, MultiPlan and/or Consumers Mutual related to the June 22, 2018 report by Plante & Moran is necessary and appropriate for the effective and efficient administration of this liquidation proceeding and will assist in providing maximum protection to creditors, policyholders, and the public; and


WHEREAS, the Liquidator has selected Plante & Moran to conduct the review and analysis of additional information provided by Cofinity, KBA, MultiPlan and/or Consumers Mutual related to the June 22, 2018 report by Plante & Moran, to be compensated as set forth in Attachment A of the Petition for Approval of Plante & Moran Professional Services Agreement, and has determined that Plante

& Moran's fee arrangement is competitive, reasonable, and appropriate under the circumstances;

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Court APPROVES Plante & Moran's compensation fixed by the Liquidator to review and analyze additional information provided by Cofinity, KBA, MultiPlan and/or Consumers Mutual related to the June 22, 2018 report by Plante & Moran in the amount set forth in Exhibit A of the Petition for Approval of Plante & Moran Professional Services Agreement.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that due to the difficulty and prohibitive cost associated with providing personalized notice of the *Ex Parte* Petition and this Order to any individuals or entities that may have a general interest in Consumer Mutual's liquidation, the Court authorizes, approves, and/or ratifies the Liquidator's service of the *Ex Parte* Petition and this Order by posting electronic copies on the DIFS website, [www.michigan.gov/difs](http://www.michigan.gov/difs), under the section "Who We Regulate," the subsection "Receiverships," and the sub-section "Consumers Mutual Ins. of Michigan." Service in this manner is reasonably calculated to give any potentially interested individuals or entities actual notice of these proceedings and is otherwise reasonable under the circumstance.
