EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Department of Technology, Management and Budget, in accordance with Section 221(1) of Public Act 128 of 2009, has prepared this Policy Changes Implementing 2009 Public Acts Report. The Acts states:

“Sec. 221. (1) Each department shall report no later than April 1, 2010 on each specific policy change made to implement a public act affecting the department that took effect during the prior calendar year to the house and senate appropriations subcommittees on the budget for the department, the joint committee on administrative rules, and the senate and house fiscal agencies.”

With the exception of appropriations bills, during calendar year 2009, two acts impacting department activities became law. Following enactment, the Department made policy changes or took other actions to implement those acts where necessary.

72	Senate Bill 596	Provides for the conveyance of the Upper Peninsula State fairgrounds to Delta County for public purpose.	The transfer of the property is completed. The Department inventoried the surplus personal property and transferred the real and necessary personal property to the County.
147	HB 4995	Requires print images of the State of Michigan to include the Upper Peninsula.	Communicated with DTMB graphics personnel on statute requirement.
217	House Bill 5207	The Act removes the public usage requirement in two acts, which previously conveyed two pieces of property to Western Michigan University. The Act also conveys a third piece to WMU for \$1 for public purpose.	The transfer of the property is nearly complete. The Governor recently signed the deeds transferring or amending the titles of the property.
