ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Experience: Beginner

Gear: Participants should be dressed to be comfortable outdoors for the day. We will run these classes rain or shine. Although we have access to the pavilion, be prepared to be outside of the pavilion for portions of the class as well.

Bring water and anything else you will need to stay healthy and comfortable for each two-hour class.

If taking both classes, participants should pack their own lunch or make other lunch plans. (There will be a 2-hour lunch break between classes.)

About PRESQUE ISLE PARK:

Summer, 1891. Fredrick Law Olmsted, a landscape architect most famous for his role in designing New York City's Central Park visits Marquette to work on a design project. To make the most of his visit, the city also directs him to a large peninsula just north of town in hopes of designing a management plan to turn it into a suitable park. Upon touring the land, he gives the city relatively straight-forward advice that can be summed up in three words:

Don't touch it.

Presque Isle Park is one of the most visited sites in Marquette County for good reason. With ease of access, this 323-acre forested peninsula extends into the water offering visitors unmatched views of Lake Superior.

About the Classes:

Participants will meet at the Presque Isle Senior Pavilion 15 minutes before class starts. PARTICIPANTS MAY ATTEND ONE OR BOTH CLASSES.

Beginner Knot Tying

- Time: 10am to Noon
- Description: In beginner knot tying, the instructor will demonstrate and teach how to tie various knots that are useful in the outdoors. This is a hands-on class, and you will be provided with rope for practice. Knots taught may include the overhand, square, half hitch, trailer hitch, bowline, and figure eight. The focus will be on foundational knots and knots with frequent usage in the outdoors, as well as others requested by participants.

Beginner Map and Compass

- Time: 2pm to 4pm
- Description: There will be three components to the Map and Compass Class. First, we will learn the basics on how to successfully read a map, as well as learn the differences in types of maps and their appropriate usage. Second, we will learn the basics of compass usage and terminology. Lastly, we will put our new skills to practice in a hands-on compass course.
