



## Natural Resources Job

Michigan Civilian Conservation Corps/AmeriCorps Stewardship Crews are part of the Michigan Department of Natural Resources, Parks and Recreation Division resource protection team. If you are interested in ecological restoration and natural resources management this may be the opportunity for you.

**POSITION:** MCCC Stewardship Crew, Brighton

**PAY RATE:** Corps Member: \$9.25 an hour

**GRANT AWARD:** Educational Grant Awards up to \$6,095

**WORK SCHEDULE** Monday-Thursday, 10-hour days. Job includes frequent overnight travel and has some weekend work.

**DUTIES:**

- Controls invasive plants within various state parks. Control techniques will likely include:
  - Cutting brush and trees with a chainsaw, clearing saw, bow saw, or other equipment
  - Removing brush and woody debris by means of chipping or brush pile burning
  - Applying herbicide to stumps and/or foliage
  - Mowing and hand pulling herbaceous vegetation
- Prepares burn breaks and will assist in conducting prescribed burns.
- Collects, processes, and assist with planting native seed.
- Collects data and completes documentation of field work.
- Assist with and/or leads volunteer work days.
- Assist with the maintenance of stewardship equipment and the Stewardship Field Office
- May assist with Forest Health work.

**POSITION INFORMATION:** This eight person stewardship crew will implement ecological restoration and other resource management (stewardship) activities on state parks and recreation areas. A lot of the work will benefit some of the most imperiled species and natural communities in Michigan. This is an excellent opportunity to gain valuable hands-on experience in ecological restoration and other types of resource management. Crew members should understand and appreciate the non-financial rewards of helping to preserve Michigan's natural resources for this and future generations.

**ABOUT MCCC/AMERICORPS:** MCCC Crew members have the opportunity to join AmeriCorps, the domestic program of the Peace Corps. AmeriCorps provides educational grants upon completion of set time requirements. The education award may be used for any qualifying form of higher education from vocational training to graduate school, or may be used to repay existing student loans. Other benefits include paid personal annual leave and paid administrative leave for career development and job searches. Term commitments available are 1700 hour (less than a year), and 900 hour (about a half year). A limited amount of 450 hour terms may be available but are mostly reserved for the summer.

**QUALIFICATIONS:**

- Applicants must be between 18 and 27 years of age and meet all MCCC requirements to qualify.
- Minimum of high school graduate, resident of Michigan, and not the son or daughter of an elected official
- Willing to use herbicides and pesticides. Must be willing to obtain pesticide applicator certifications in the required categories.
- Willingness to safely use power equipment, including clearing and chain saws.
- Good physical condition to conduct long days of strenuous field work, often under adverse conditions in remote areas. Must be able to endure biting insects and work in all weather conditions.
- Must pass a physical examination/fitness test, to work on prescribed burns.
- Ability to work independently and in a team environment.
- Must be committed to the stewardship of the natural ecosystems within Michigan State Parks.

**APPLICATION PROCEDURE:**

- Applications are accepted year-round and filled as positions open up.
