



River Congress will help students participating in the Saginaw School River Monitoring Project to learn more about our watershed and give them an opportunity to see the Saginaw Bay into which the Saginaw River drains, and also give them exposure to natural resource careers, and recreational opportunities in the out-of-doors.



Each class will participate in three, 45-minute sessions lead by park staff, and natural resource professionals from area agencies such as MDNR, MDEQ, MDCH, EPA, Army Corp, USDA, USF & Wildlife and County Conservation Districts. Each class will experience a guided field excursion; a sit down demonstration, discussion or presentation; and a outdoor recreational activity. Students will also have the opportunity to display and compete in the School River Monitoring Project Report Contest during the event.

After registering you class you will receive a detailed list of "Natural Resource Sessions", "Field Excursions" and "Outdoor Recreation" electives to select from.

*Wetlands-Nature's Water Filter!*, Friday, April 20, 2007 *(Alternate dates are available in April)*

An outdoor Water Quality Investigation –students will participate in four outdoor labs which demonstrate four ways water quality is evaluated; students will discover the valuable role wetlands play as "nature's water filter"; students will utilize limnological instruments and indexes, canoes, and water chemical tests to evaluate water quality of the Tobico Lagoon—a great hands on field trip for students participating in the Saginaw River School River Monitoring Project.
