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Background

- Major emphasis on simplifying deer regulations
- Provide expanded opportunities for most hunters
 - Concern for "overharvest" throughout much of Michigan waning
 - 1998: ~837,000 hunters; ~598,000 deer harvested
 - 2018: ~554,000 hunters; ~361,000 deer harvested
 - We will lose >100,000 hunters over next decade
 - Only ~15% of hunters take 2 or more deer; only 4% of hunters take 3 or more deer

Expanded opportunities in Liberty/Independence Hunts

- Individuals who are deaf now eligible to participate in these hunts
 - If they receive information through lip reading, sign language, finger spelling, or reading, they will qualify



Antler Point Restriction Policy Changes

- Meeting held September 7th, 2019:
 - Professionally facilitated meeting
 - Attendees from DNR, Farm Bureau, Michigan Bow Hunters, MUCC, Oakland Hunt Club, Thumb Hunters for APRs, QDMA, West UP CAC, United Sportsmen's Alliance, and UP Whitetails
 - Topics Covered
 - How to simplify exemptions for APRs?
 - What supporting percentage should trigger a Departmental recommendation from the survey?
 - Can a management framework be developed that includes comprehensive deer management considerations?

Antler Point Restriction Recommendations

- Topics Covered:
 - Simplify Antler Point Rule exemptions
 - Current APR exemptions are confusing and difficult to communicate
 - Desire to increase opportunities and success for novice hunters
 - Supported by APR work group

License Type	Current APR exemption	Proposed APR exemption
Mentored Youth (age 9 and younger)	Exempt	Exempt in all seasons, regions and licenses
Junior (age 10-16)	Exempt in Liberty season only	Exempt in all seasons, regions and licenses
Apprentice holders	Not exempt	Exempt in all seasons, regions and licenses

All group members supported simplifying exemptions. One group did not support APR exemptions on the restricted tag of the combination license



Antler Point Restriction Policy Changes

- Topics Covered
 - What supporting percentage should trigger a Departmental recommendation from the survey?
 - For APR implementation, surveys must now obtain a 60% support level rather than a 66% level.
 - Support percentage to be maintained for at least 10 years.
 - Ten-year moratorium on failed initiatives.
 - A percentage of survey respondents must include DMAP and Crop Damage permit holders from affected areas.
 - Survey respondents and how many years to query hunters will be determined by DNR survey specialist and deer program.
 - Consensus reached by all members.



Antler Point Restriction Policy Changes


- Topics Covered
 - Can a management framework be developed that includes comprehensive deer management considerations?
 - Group agreed to having some management framework in place that includes benchmarks or metrics.
 - Agreed other representation is needed.
 - Delayed action for a future work group
 - Consensus reached by all members



Standardized Private Land Antlerless limits

- Recommendation:
 - Standardized private land antlerless caps
 - Recommend 10 private land antlerless licenses across all DMUs; currently 5 except in disease areas
 - Better allows hunters to control deer without need for biologists to issue DMAPS to hunters who need more

than 5 licenses





Hunter Orange on Occupied Ground Blinds

- Recommendation:
 - Require ground blinds to have 144
 square inches of orange visible from 360 degrees while deer hunting
 - Applicable on all hunting lands
 - When orange is required (not early archery)
 - Wearing hunter orange can substitute, if visible
 - Not applicable to elevated stands and blinds





Eliminate Single-Bite Bait Language


- Recommendation:
 - Standardize baiting language for the Liberty and Independence seasons
 - Baiting allowed in Liberty and Independence hunts for qualified individuals (6 days)
 - Decision made to allow single-bite baits in disease management units
 - No evidence that single bite baits are more effective at slowing transmission
 - Confusing to hunters







 - APRs removed in most of DMU 122 last year

LP Quota Changes

- Increases to public land on 23 DMUs
- Increases to private land on 12 DMUs


- Increases represent:
 - changes in management philosophy
 - ex. Allegan County and EHD recovery
 - meeting demand
 - ex. Newaygo County sells out all public applications, but about ¼ fail to purchase their successful draw



LP Deer/Combo License Changes

Recommendation:

- Allow antlerless deer to be taken during firearms/muzzleloader seasons
- Maintain APRs based on support from previous surveys
- Maintain experimental regulations for CWD




Current regulations throughout LP




LP Deer/Combo License Changes


- Simplifies regulations for hunters
- Long-term, will slow the decline of antlerless harvest associated with fewer hunters
- Anticipate decreased antlerless and deer license purchases
 - Increased combo license purchases



Early/Late Antlerless Seasons

- Recommendation:
 - Open entire LP to early and late antierless firearm season.
 - Mainland DMU's only; islands still closed

Early/Late Antlerless Season License Eligibilities

- Recommendation:
 - Allow antlerless deer to be taken on a deer/combo license during early and late antlerless seasons
 - Currently allowed in disease areas
 - Provides consistency across all areas where seasons are allowed

Muzzleloader & Late **Antlerless Season Date** Changes

Recommendation:

- Change dates of muzzleloader and late antlerless seasons
 - Shorten muzzleloader season to 10- day season For 2020 season (with proposed change)
 - Late antlerless begins Monday after muzzleloader concludes
 - Provides consistency across all regions
 - Expands late antlerless in NIP
 - Shortens MZ in SE and SW, but expands late antlerless in both

Muzzleloader Season Changes

Recommendation


- Convert muzzleloader season to allow all legal firearms in the SLP
 - Legal firearms currently allowed in CWD MZ
 - Originally proposed to be more inclusive, increase harvest and participation








Free-ranging White-tailed Deer Positive for Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD) Michigan



Recommendations:

Current carcass
 movement restriction
 is confusing, difficult to
 enforce with current
 language, and
 continues to allow for
 high risk movement



Green: permitted movements under current guidelines Red: restricted movements under current guidelines



Recommendations:

- Surveillance informs management; restriction now scaled to areas where CWD is widespread
- Carcass movement restriction reduced to all of Montcalm County, and parts of Kent and Ionia Counties
- Only low-risk material can be removed from this area (deboned meat, quarters, etc)
 - Unless animal is brought to taxidermist or processor for disposal
- No longer need to present deer at a check station





Continue Extended Urban Archery Opportunities

- Continue Expanded
 Urban Archery for 1 more year
 - Three-year pilot expired on January 31, 2020
 - Continue archery season through January 31, 2021 in Wayne, Oakland, and Macomb counties
 - Discuss expanded archery as part of upcoming discussions
