³ This category includes conservancy lands and local government conservation lands. The DNR is still working with local ownerships as potential partners, which may result in a few additional ERAs being identified and added to these totals in the future.

⁴ Some individual ERAs cross ownership types and are counted in both ownership categories, but this total does not double-count the ERAs in those situations.

⁵ This total includes 1,961 acres that are forested and without previous limits on timber harvest, but where upon becoming ERAs timber harvest will most likely not occur unless needed to restore or maintain the natural community represented.
