- WHEN: 2012
- WHOM: MDNR, MSU, LITTLE TRAVERSE BAY BAND of ODAWA INDIANS
- WHAT: Walleye Population Survey
- WHY: Estimate Population Size, Measure Growth Rates, Movement and Reproductive Success
- METHODS: MDNR Capture – Tag - Release. **REPORT ALL TAG RECOVERIES!**
- REWARD** about half the tags carry a \$10 reward for anglers returning them!
- NEEDED: Angler Cooperation!!!
- DETAILS: A metal jaw tag (photo below) will have an address and number. Anglers catching tagged fish should record the tag information and report it online at (www.michigandnr.com/taggedfish/) or send it to the address given, or present the tag to a DNR or MSU representative. *If you catch a fish that will be released, please remove the tag before releasing the fish.*
