- 205: Michigan-Wisconsin Boundary Waters
- 206: Special Fishing Regulations for Warmwater Species on Select Lakes
- 215: Statewide Warmwater Species Regulations
- 243: State-Licensed Commercial Fishing (Director's authority)


Fisheries Order 205 For Information Only

- Add consistency for Muskellunge regulations on the MI-WI boundary waters.
 - Increase minimum size limit from 42 to 50"
 - Extend possession season to Dec. 31st



Fisheries Order 205 For Information Only

- Bass Regulations on the MI-WI boundary waters.
 - Align possession season dates by extending season to Dec. 31st




Fisheries Order 206 For Information Only

- Cheboygan River from Mullett Lake downstream to Cheboygan Dam, and Black River downstream of Alverno Dam.
 - Add delayed possession season date (May 15th) to protect spawning walleye.
 - Previous spawning closure (FO-204) unintentionally limited bass CIR opportunities.



Fisheries Order 206 For Information Only

- Northern Pike Regulations
 - Twin Tomahawk lakes (Montmorency Co.): Add 5 fish daily possession limit with no more than 1 over 24"
 - Magician Lake (St. Joseph Co.): Add 24-34" protected slot limit with a two fish daily possession limit
 - Add McDonald Lake to Hamilton Lake (Delta Co.) for comprehensive naming
 - Lake Lavine (Branch Co.): Remove no size limit and possession limit



Fisheries Order 215 For Information Only

- Add simplicity to Walleye Regulations in the Detroit River, Lake St. Clair, and St. Clair River.
 - Align daily possession limits for these connected waters
 - Daily possession limits will be determined using Lake Erie harvest quota process



Fisheries Order 243 For Information Only – Director's Authority

 Modify commercial fishing reporting requirements to better align with the new electronic reporting process.



What is WNS?

- Disease caused by fungus
- Pseudogymnoascus destructans (Pd)
- Causes energy depletion
- Impacts whole suite of cave bat species; little brown, northern long-eared, tricolored, and big brown bats




Impacts of WNS

- 90-100% mortality
- Cause of northern long-eared bat (NLEB) declines
- U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service has listed the NLEB as a threatened species



WNS in Michigan

- Michigan in 6th year of infection
- All hibernacula have presence of WNS
- Bats provide farmers
 3.7 billion dollars of pest control services annually




WNS Impacts in Michigan

- 30 hibernacula surveyed in 2018
- Survey data indicate 89% decline of the 45 sites surveyed post-WNS infection
- Colder hibernacula continue to have higher survival



What is MI DNR Doing to Combat WNS?

- Statewide bat monitoring
 - Disease
 - Acoustic
- Protect critical hibernacula
- WNS treatment trials
- Outreach/ education
- Bat Habitat Conservation Plan (HCP)





WNS Field Treatment Trials

- Chlorine dioxide
 - Kill Pd fungus
 - Initial results encouraging



- Chitosan
 - Helps heal tissue and suppresses growth of Pd fungus



Hibernacula Climate Manipulation

 Reduce internal temperatures to 36-38 degrees F

Lake States HCP

- MI, WI, MN
- Necessary to obtain incidental take permit
- Protection from litigation for forestry management practices while providing habitat conservation for federally listed species
