





MEMORANDUM TO THE NATURAL RESOURCES COMMISSION

Subject: Fisheries Order 202.21
Special Hook Size Fishing Regulations

Authority:

The Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act, 1994 PA 451, authorizes the Director and the Commission to issue Orders to regulate the taking of fish in the waters of this state.

Discussion and Background:

Fisheries Order 202 governs special hook regulations on select waters to protect susceptible fish during spawning migrations. Fisheries Division is proposing a modification to an existing provision for the Bear River in Emmet County to clarify the downstream boundary of the regulation. The Bear River flows into an area with a marina and breakwall before entering Lake Michigan. Anglers and law enforcement personnel have indicated that the area is confusing because of the design layout. Therefore, adding a more specific landmark "foot bridge north of Lake Street," to the downstream boundary description will help clarify the boundary better for everyone.

Issue Pros and Cons

Adding a more specific landmark for the downstream boundary of this special regulation will benefit anglers and law enforcement personnel. Anglers will now be able to discern exactly where the boundary is so they can follow the special regulations.

Biological

The change is not based upon biology; however, the fishery resource will benefit by the change because anglers will be able to identify better where the more protective regulations are being implemented.

Social

Anglers are supportive of special regulations to protect unique and high-quality fishing populations which provide a diverse public fishing opportunity. This change should result in better angler compliance because the boundary is easier to see.

Economic







FISHERIES ORDER

Special Hook Size Regulations Order 202.21

By authority conferred on the Natural Resources Commission and the Department of Natural Resources by Part 487 of 1994 PA 451, MCL 324.48701 to 324.48740, ordered on September 10, 2020, the following section(s) of the Fisheries Order shall read effective April 1, 2021, except as otherwise provided:

- 1) Streams where it shall be unlawful to use other than one single-pointed un-weighted hook measuring ½-inch or less from point to shank:

County	Stream
Allegan	Swan Creek (from the mouth upstream to the dam at 118th Avenue)
Benzie	Platte River
Berrien	Townsend Creek (T6S, R17W, S19 and the mouth area of Lake Chapin, to a point 100 yards below the Townsend Creek mouth into Lake Chapin)
Charlevoix	Boyne River (from mouth upstream to dam in T32N, R5W, S5)
Emmet	Bear River (from foot bridge north of Lake Street upstream to Lake Street Dam T34N, R5W, S6)
Van Buren	South Branch Black River and all tributaries upstream of Breedsville (Mill Street).

- 2) For the purpose of this section, an artificial lure is defined as a body bait, plug, spinner, or spoon. An artificial lure is not a device primarily constructed of lead. From August 1 through November 15, inclusive, terminal fishing gear is restricted to single-pointed hooks or jigs, measuring ½-inch or less from point to shank or treble hooks measuring ⅜-inch or less from point to shank only when attached to an artificial lure on the following waters:
 - a. Benzie County: all waters of the Betsie River.
 - b. Manistee County: all waters of Bear Creek, all waters of the Betsie River, and the Manistee River from Tippy Dam downstream to Railroad Bridge below M-55 (T21N, R16W, S6).
 - c. Mason County: the Big Sable River (from mouth upstream to Hamlin Lake Dam).
 - d. Mason, Lake, Oceana, Newaygo: all waters of the Pere Marquette River.
 - e. Manistee, Mason, and Lake Counties: all waters of the Little Manistee River.
 - f. Muskegon and Oceana Counties: the White River (from mouth upstream to Hesperia Dam) and all waters of the North Branch White River.
 - g. Muskegon and Newaygo Counties: the Muskegon River upstream to Croton Dam.

- h. Oceana and Mason Counties: all waters of the North Branch Pentwater River, South Branch Pentwater River (upstream to Hart Dam).

This Order shall be assigned number FO-202.21 and is entitled "Special Hook Size Regulations."

This Order supersedes the Order entitled "Special Hook Size Regulations," which became effective April 1, 2019, and is assigned number FO-202.19.

This Order shall take effect April 1, 2021 and shall remain in effect until amended/rescinded.

MEMORANDUM TO THE NATURAL RESOURCES COMMISSION

Subject: Fisheries Order 204.20A
Spawning Closures

Authority:

The Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act, 1994 PA 451, authorizes the Director and the Commission to issue Orders to regulate the taking of fish in the waters of this state.

Discussion and Background:

Fisheries Order 204 establishes spawning closures on specific waters to protect fishery resources during spawning migrations. The Department recommends adding two new spawning closures and removing one spawning closure from the Order.

The Betsie River Homestead Dam area in Benzie County has been identified as a location where migrating salmon are vulnerable to unlawful angling activities. There is currently a spawning closure at the same location within 100 feet of the lamprey barrier and fish passage facility all year. However, fisheries and law enforcement staff have identified that the location creates a pinch point during the fall salmon spawning migration. This is creating an issue because there are large numbers of fish at times in a small area which is no longer a fair chase angling opportunity. As a result, this has become an area rampant with unlawful fishing activities. The addition of the spawning closure will allow for the greater protection of the vulnerable fishery resources during the time when protection is needed the most. Land Use Order of the Director 4 of 2020, was presented at the July 16, 2020 Natural Resources Commission meeting which recommended a closure to camping at the Homestead Dam location because of the large number of people congregating in this area during the fall spawning run that resulted in shoreline erosion and littering concerns.

The Torch River in Antrim and Kalkaska Counties between Torch Lake and Lake Skegemog has been an area where highly valued native Great Lakes strain muskellunge have been known to spawn. The Torch River is an important muskellunge spawning area and these large fish are easy to see in the crystal-clear waters during spawning season. Unfortunately, the Torch River has been a place where anglers have been seen harassing and trying to snag the fish when these fish are spawning in the shallow waters. In order to protect this highly valued fishery the Department recommends adding a spawning closure in the Torch River.

The Douglas Lake pike marsh in Cheboygan County has not been in operation for years and there are no future plans to operate the pike marsh; therefore, the Department has decided that the spawning closure is no longer warranted. The removal will get rid of an unnecessary regulation.

Therefore, the following changes are proposed:

1. Add – Benzie County: Betsie River Homestead Dam closed to fishing from August 1 – November 15 within 300 feet of the lamprey barrier and fish passage facility (T25N, R15W, S2).
2. Add – Antrim and Kalkaska Counties: Torch River closed to fishing from May 1 – June 15 from Torch River starting at the Crystal Beach Road Bridge downstream to Lake Skegemog including Rapid River up to Aarwood Road Bridge.
3. Remove – Cheboygan County: Douglas Lake pike marsh.

The Department recommends that this Order take immediate effect to add greater protection to migrating salmon during this fall. A press release will be developed, the online Fishing Guide will be updated, and the pre-recorded message will be updated at 888-367-7060 to help inform the anglers about the new closure on the Betsie River.

Issue Pros and Cons

The addition of two new spawning closures will result in greater protection of the resource in areas where unlawful fishing activities have been a problem. The closures will result in easier enforcement as no fishing will be allowed in these areas during specific time frames. Anyone seen fishing during the closure at either location will be subject to fines under Michigan law.

Biological

Fishery resources during spawning migrations can be vulnerable to unlawful activities in areas where they become confined in a small area in high numbers. This creates an opportunity where some people can see the fish easily and can tempt some to catch the fish in any manner possible including unlawfully. Adding the closures will protect the resource and make law enforcement easier because no angling will be allowed in the locations during the date of the closures.

Social

Anglers are supportive of special regulations to protect unique and high-quality fishing populations which provide diverse public fishing opportunities. Many people support the fair chase of highly valued fishery resources such as these.

Economic



MEMORANDUM TO THE NATURAL RESOURCES COMMISSION

Subject: Fisheries Order 210.21
Designated Trout Streams for Michigan

Authority:

The Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act, 1994 PA 451, authorizes the Director and the Commission to issue Orders to regulate the taking of fish in the waters of this state.

Discussion and Background:

Fisheries Order 210 governs designated trout streams in Michigan. Fisheries Division recommends adding one stream to the Order and removing one stream from the Order. Carter Creek in Roscommon County has recently been surveyed where a thriving brook trout population has been documented. Adding Carter Creek to the Order will result in greater protection of brook trout by placing it into Type 1 trout fishing regulations. This will place a fishing and possession season from the last Saturday in April through September 30. The closed season will protect brook trout when they are most vulnerable during spawning season. Wright Creek in Oscoda County has been recommended for removal since the habitat is not suitable for trout. Several fisheries surveys have failed to document any trout and temperature data indicates that this is a warmwater stream which will not support trout. Removing Wright Creek will result in defaulting to general statewide fishing regulations open all year to fishing.

Issue Pros and Cons

Adding a stream to this Order will result in placing more protective fishing regulations on a valued trout population. Removing a stream from the Order will relax fishing regulations and allow more angling opportunities for people. There are no cons identified.

Biological

Greater protection will be placed on the brook trout population identified in Carter Creek resulting in a closed fishing season during spawning. This will allow the brook trout to spawn without angling pressure. The removal of Wright Creek from trout regulations is the best way to manage this stream given that more protective trout regulations are not warranted here.

Social

Anglers are supportive of regulations to protect valued trout populations. Anglers will benefit from the removal of Wright Creek which will open fishing to all year.

Economic







MEMORANDUM TO THE NATURAL RESOURCES COMMISSION

Subject: Fisheries Order 219.21
Bow, Spear, and Crossbow Fishing Regulations

Authority:

The Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act, 1994 PA 451, authorizes the Director and the Commission to issue Orders to regulate the taking of fish in the waters of this state.

Discussion and Background:

Fisheries Order 219 governs fishing regulations for bow, spear, and crossbows. One change is proposed for this Order regarding the removal of North Manistique (Round) Lake in Luce County. The spearing prohibition was implemented on this lake when muskellunge stocking was initiated in the early 2000s. Managers were concerned that juvenile muskellunge and northern pike could be misidentified by spearing anglers to the detriment of the muskellunge stocking program. Fall fingerling muskellunge were stocked in 2004, 2008, 2012, 2014, and 2016. Managers have recently been evaluating the stocking program in North Manistique (Round) Lake to determine how effective the muskellunge stocking program has been at developing a valued muskellunge fishery. There have been no reports from anglers of muskellunge sighted or caught. A robust fisheries survey was conducted in 2019 targeting muskellunge which failed to capture any. As a result of the findings, fisheries management efforts for North Manistique (Round) Lake will no longer focus on muskellunge. The removal of this water from the Order will result in opening the lake to northern pike and muskellunge spearing through the ice from December 1 through March 15.

Issue Pros and Cons

This change will allow anglers to target northern pike and muskellunge during the winter spearing season. No cons have been identified.

Biological

There is no longer a biological rationale to maintain the spearing ban placed on this lake to protect stocked muskellunge. Managers maintain that the muskellunge stocking effort did not create a fishery as desired, so management efforts will no longer focus on this species.

Social

Anglers are supportive of special regulations to protect unique and high-quality fishing populations which provide diverse public fishing opportunities. However, when there is evidence that special regulations are no longer needed, anglers benefit from the removal of the special regulation.

Economic


The Department does not expect the proposed changes to have any significant budgetary or personnel implications.





FISHERIES ORDER

Bow, Spear, and Crossbow Fishing Regulations Order 219.21

By authority conferred on the Natural Resources Commission and the Department of Natural Resources by Part 487 of 1994 PA 451, MCL 324.48701 to 324.48740, ordered on September 10, 2020, the following section(s) of the Fisheries Order shall read effective April 1, 2021, as follows:

The seasons, gear, waters, and species where a spear, bow and arrow, or crossbow may be used are as specified in the table below and lists which follow (except as otherwise prohibited). Spearing gear shall be limited to: hand-propelled spear, rubber-propelled spear, spring-propelled spear, bow and arrow, and crossbow. Artificial lights may be used. It shall be unlawful to use a rubber-propelled spear or a spring-propelled spear without being submerged and have the spear under control by means of an attached line not exceeding 20 feet in length. It is unlawful to spear any fish in a waterbody closed to fishing, except as noted in the spearing exceptions list.


Notice: This item will appear on the Department of Natural Resources (Department) September 1, 2020 calendar and is eligible for approval on September 8, 2020.

Management Purpose: The Department has partnered with the MMWA on a new wetland mitigation banking program that will preserve and restore wetland habitat. The purpose of this easement is to restore, protect, manage, maintain, and enhance the functional values of wetlands and other lands; and for the conservation of natural values including fish and wildlife and their habitat, water quality improvement, flood water retention, groundwater recharge, open space, aesthetic values, and environmental education.

- Comments: The conservation easement will be conveyed jointly to the Department and the MMWA. The easement demonstrates to United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) and the Natural Resource Conservation Service (NRCS) the permanent protection of the wetland restored at this site. The conservation easement is required so that wetland mitigation credits can be released to offset the wetland functions and values for farmers out of compliance with the wetland provisions of the Farm Bill. The property, which will yield 92 acres of credits, is in the St. Joe watershed and has been approved by the USDA and NRCS.
- Recommendation: 1. That the acquisition be approved, with payment to be made by the MMWA.




