## VOLUNTEER FIRE ASSISTANCE PROJECT PRIORITY INFORMATION

Issued by authority of Part 515, Act 451, P.A. 1994 as amended.

The intent of the Volunteer Fire Assistance (VFA) program is to assist small, rural departments who have difficulty in financing their basic needs. The funds available for this year have yet to be determined.

Under the Cooperative Forestry Assistance Act of 1978, funds are allocated for fire department use in three broad categories: training, organization, and equipment. Each state may establish its priorities within these categories based on the individual needs of the state.

In Michigan, training is available through the Fire Fighter's Training Council and the Department of Natural Resources at minimal expense to the fire department. Other courses obtained through community colleges and the University of Michigan fall within the VFA program.

Organization is a difficult category in which to substantiate direct cost to the fire department's development. Consequently, we have not considered organization as a specific grant category, but have directed the funds to equipment, feeling that equipment will be the first priority of a new department.

To be eligible, local fire departments shall be located in governmental units or fire protection districts with permanent populations of less than 10,000.

Fire equipment items such as those listed in the project priority guide on the back side of this page will be a major project funded. Please note that the program cannot fund buildings, vehicles, or used equipment, nor can it be used for operating expenses or maintenance.
