Transaction: Transfer of Jurisdiction
Sugarloaf Lake Boating Access Site – Kalamazoo County
Jurisdictional Transfer of 22.79 acres from Parks and Recreation Division to Wildlife Division

Description: Kalamazoo County, City of Portage, T03S, R11W, Section 32:
All that part of the south eighty (80) acres of the southwest fractional quarter lying west of Shaver Road, except the west ten acres and the south 450 feet thereof.

Authority: Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act, 1994 PA 451, as amended.

Comments: The state-owned 25.79-acre tract was acquired in 1974 with Waterways Funds and dedicated as the Sugarloaf Lake Boating Access Site, with three acres presently developed. The property is within the Gourneck State Game Area project boundary and the Parks and Recreation Division is requesting that the northern 22.79 acres be transferred to the Wildlife Division as the land administering division in order to align with current management practices.

Recommendation: That the administrative jurisdiction of the above referenced 22.79 acres be transferred from the Parks and Recreation Division to the Wildlife Division and be managed as part of the Gourneck State Game Area.

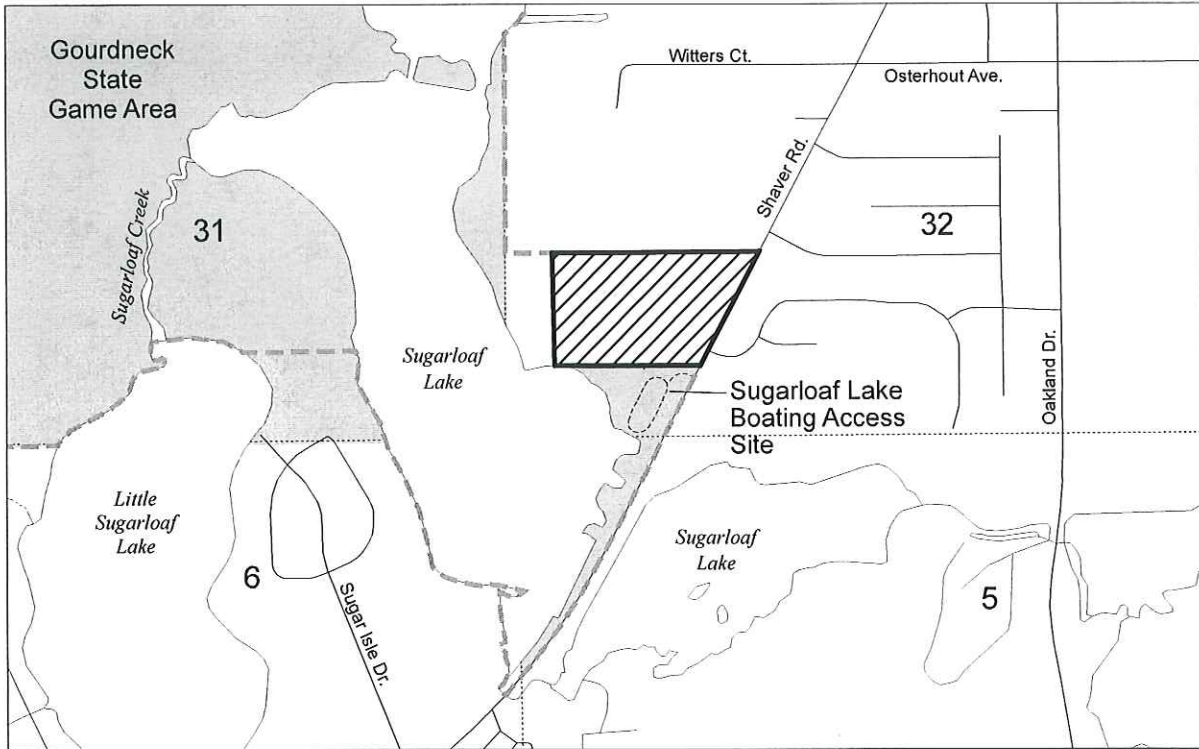

From Parks and Recreation Division to Wildlife Division



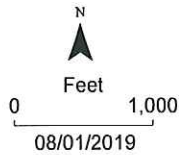
Section 32, T03S, R11W, City of Portage
