# **PROPOSED PROCEDURES FOR FILING BRIEFS**

- 1. Petitioners, Drs. Taite Anderson and Lindsey Anderson, to the extent they desire to file a brief with the environmental permit panel, shall file a brief with the environmental permit panel no later than <u>August 3, 2021</u>, that shall conform with the requirements for appellants' briefs on appeal as set forth in MCR 7.212, except that Petitioners' brief shall be limited to 30 pages and Petitioners shall not be required to file an appendix as required in MCR 7.212(C)(10).
- 2. Respondent, Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy, Water Resources Division (EGLE) shall file a brief with the environmental permit panel no later than <u>September 7, 2021</u>, in response to Petitioners' brief that shall conform with the requirements for appellees' briefs on appeal as set forth in MCR 7.212, except that Respondent's brief shall be limited to 30 pages and Respondent shall not be required to file an appendix as required in MCR 7.212(J)(2).
- 3. Petitioners, to the extent they desire to file a reply brief with the environmental permit panel, shall file a reply brief with the environmental permit panel no later than <u>September 21, 2021</u>, that shall conform with the requirements for reply briefs on appeal as set forth in MCR 7.212, except that Petitioners' reply brief shall be limited to 5 pages.

4. Within the time frame for filing briefs, the parties shall e-mail copies of their briefs to the other parties at the addresses identified below.
