## National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (Non-Storm Water) Program Fund

Report Period: Fiscal Year 2019

Authority: MCL 324.3121(5)

This report fulfills the reporting requirement contained in Section 3121(5) of the 2004 PA 91 amendment to the Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act, 1994 PA 451, as amended.

The activities discussed in this report represent the fiscal year (FY) 2019 activities performed in administering the Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy's (EGLE) National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Program that were funded by the NPDES Fund.

There were approximately 66 full-time equivalent (FTE) positions in FY 2019 in this program that were not funded by the NPDES fees. Additional staff was moved from this activity to perform work on per- and polyfluoroalkyl substance (PFAS) activities.

EGLE received 561 NPDES permit applications.

Activity (e):

Zero permit applications were denied.

Activity (f):

Permit applicants withdrew 36 applications.

Activity (g):

The percentage and number of permit applications reviewed for administrative completeness within statutory time frames were 83 percent and 467, respectively.

Activity (h):

EGLE received 214 permit applications (38 percent) that were administratively complete as received.

Activity (i):

EGLE took final action for 57 out of 62 new permit applications (92 percent) within 180 days, and 150 out of 252 applications for reissuance (59 percent) within the required time frame.

Activity (j):

EGLE did not reopen any permits to put them in the proper basin year.

Activity (k):

There were zero unfilled positions dedicated to the NPDES Program at the end of FY 2019.

Activity (I):

The amount of revenue in the NPDES Fund at the end of FY 2019 was \$900,100.
