Subject: Crown Pillar Engineering Assessment (Phase 4) - Eagle Mine MP 01 2007

The Oil, Gas, and Minerals Division (OGMD) of the Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy (EGLE) has reviewed the Crown Pillar Engineering Assessment (Phase 4) submitted by Eagle Mine on July 8, 2019, and has determined that the underground data collected has met the requirements of MP 01 2007, Special Permit Condition E8. The results of the assessment, environmental monitoring, and observations of the geologic conditions in the upper development levels, rock core quality, and achievement of tight rock fill, continue to support mining levels above 327.5 Meters Above Sea Level (MASL) with no anticipated adverse impacts to surface water or surface features, including the level between 352 and 381 MASL.

It is the understanding of EGLE that mining will not occur above the 381 L sill development and that applicable data will continue to be collected to confirm the Phase 4 assessment conclusions. As Eagle Mine moves forward with the development of the uppermost levels of the Eagle ore deposit and implementation of the Crown Pillar Management Plan, please continue to inform OGMD of any unanticipated hydrogeological or rock stability issues.
