

The State of Michigan's Industrial Storm Water Program's goal is to protect Michigan's public health and freshwater resources by reducing pollutants discharged from industrial facilities during storm events.

How does the program work to meet this mission statement?

Partnerships

Collaboration and cooperation from approximately 4,000 regulated industrial facilities.

Compliance Assistance

A commitment to excellent compliance assistance by providing training, program guidance tools, and consultations to help the regulated community understand their obligations regarding the program's goal.

Compliance Evaluations

Program staff perform hundreds of compliance inspections at industrial facilities annually.

Community Responsiveness

Providing timely responses to the public's inquiries, complaints, and concerns.

This program, in collaboration with other EGLE programs, ensures Michigan's approximately 10 million residents have clean drinking water, healthy watersheds, and safe water for recreation activities, which lead to increased business and tourism opportunities.
