

**Summary of Michigan Department of Environmental Quality Actions
In Response to the
United States Environmental Protection Agency Emergency Administrative Order
Updated: 2/5/2018**

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Emergency Administrative Order contains 15 overall items to be addressed by the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality (MDEQ). This update includes status only on items for which progress was made in the last week. It is anticipated that the next update to this summary will be provided on Monday, February 12, 2018.

DETAILED INFORMATION:

Paragraph 55B: LCR sampling.

- The city of Flint's LCR report covering July – December 2017 was posted on the Web site on 1/24/2018, along with the 90th percentile calculations and data.

Paragraph 62: Optimization.

- On 2/2/2018 Arcadis submitted a table of contents (TOC) and 14 Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs). These SOPs were placed on the Web site on 2/5/2018. The TOC will be updated and posted online as new SOPs are completed.

Paragraph 54: Inventory of homes with lead service lines.

- On 1/29/2018 the city of Flint posted the Request for Proposal for Hydro Exploration on their Web site. The mandatory pre-bid meeting will be held on 2/7/2018. Proposals are due on 2/15/2018.
- A community forum was held on 2/2/2018 during which Mayor Weaver discussed the plans for implementing the next phase of the service line removal program. Other infrastructure projects included in AECOM's scope of work were also discussed.

Paragraph 59: Corrosion control.

- On 1/31/2018 a kick-off meeting was held for the Flint pipe rig corrosion control study. The presentation used by Cornwell/Arcadis was placed on the Web site on 2/5/2018.

Other:

- As of 2/5/2018, the DEQ had sampled the first of three rounds of sampling of Flint Community Schools. The next round will start on 2/10/2018.
