**EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:**

The United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Emergency Administrative Order contains 15 overall items to be addressed by the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality (MDEQ). This update includes status only on items for which progress was made in the last week. It is anticipated that the next update to this summary will be provided on Monday, February 26, 2018.

**DETAILED INFORMATION:**

Paragraph 59A: water quality monitoring plans.

- On 2/20/2018, the city of Flint accepted for record the Final Revised Total Coliform Rule (RTCR) Coliform Monitoring Plan. This document was posted on the website on 2/20/2018.

Other:

- As of 2/20/2018, the MDEQ had completed Round 2 of sampling at the Flint Community Schools, combining weeks 1 and 2. The MDEQ also planned to conduct week 3 of round 2 on 2/24/2018.
- Flint Field Office (FFO) staff will be reaching out for participation in Lead and Copper Rule Investigation (LCRI) sampling. The FFO will be taking samples the first week of March, prior to the start of hydrovac work starting. Bottle drop off and pick-up is planned for the week of March 5.
