

**Summary of
Michigan Department of Environmental Quality Actions
In Response to the
United States Environmental Protection Agency
Emergency Administrative Order
Updated: 5/29/2018**

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Emergency Administrative Order contains 15 overall items to be addressed by the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality (MDEQ). This update includes status only on items for which progress was made in the last week. It is anticipated that the next update to this summary will be provided on Monday, June 4, 2018.

DETAILED INFORMATION:

Paragraph 62: System optimization

- As of 5/29/2018, the MDEQ was developing a plan to sample Flint Community Schools. The plan is to start sampling the week of June 4, after flushing occurs, to test the effectiveness of the filters. This quarterly sampling is scheduled to be complete by the end of June.

Paragraph 63: Flint Water Interagency Coordinating Committee (FWICC)

- On May 18, 2018, the EPA mailed the city of Flint (City) and the Michigan Department of Natural Resources a letter regarding the status of the FWICC, urging the City and the State to determine the most effective way to move forward with the meetings.

Other:

- The 1/30/2018, semi-annual program evaluation report for Water Infrastructure for Improvements to the Nation (WIIN) funding was placed online on 5/23/2018.
