

**Summary of
Michigan Department of Environmental Quality Actions
In Response to the
United States Environmental Protection Agency
Emergency Administrative Order
Updated: 6/18/2018**

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Emergency Administrative Order contains 15 overall items to be addressed by the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality (MDEQ). This update includes status only on items for which progress was made in the last week. It is anticipated that the next update to this summary will be provided on Monday, June 25, 2018.

DETAILED INFORMATION:

Paragraph 54: Lead service line removal

- On June 15, 2018, the city of Flint (City) sent the MDEQ a letter providing clarification around the 404 addresses that had been hydrovacced and later excavated. This letter was posted online on June 18, 2018.

Paragraph 55: LCR monitoring

- On June 14, 2018, the MDEQ sent the City a letter asking to transition responsibility for the Lead and Copper Rule (LCR) monitoring program to the City. This letter was posted online on June 18, 2018.

Paragraphs 60, 61 and 62: New source, necessary/capable staff, system optimization

- On June 11, 2018, the MDEQ sent the City a letter providing notice under 42 U.S.C. Section 300j-8 of the Safe Drinking Water Act. This was posted online on June 18, 2018.
- On June 14, 2018, the City sent the EPA a letter to correct the record regarding the sanitary sewer survey response and attaching a letter from the MDEQ dated March 21, 2018. This was posted online on June 18, 2018.

Other Documents:

- On June 11, 2018, the MDEQ sent several legislators the Report on Water Infrastructure Improvements for the Nation Act – City of Flint Legislative Report. This was posted online on June 18, 2018.
