**EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:**

The United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Emergency Administrative Order contains 15 overall items to be addressed by the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality (MDEQ). This update includes status only on items for which progress was made in the last week. It is anticipated that the next update to this summary will be provided on Monday, July 2, 2018.

**DETAILED INFORMATION:**

**Paragraph 54: Lead service line removal**

- On June 22, 2018, the city of Flint sent the MDEQ a letter stating they had placed a temporary moratorium on hydro-excavation as a means of characterizing service line materials. Attached to this was a related letter and memorandum. This information was posted online on June 25, 2018.

**Paragraph 62: System Optimization**

- As of June 25, 2018, sampling of the Flint Community Schools continues. This is the last week of this quarter's sampling. In addition, repairs are being made by Michigan Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs to fix some leaks and improperly anchored units identified at some schools during the sampling effort.
