

**Summary of Michigan Department of Environmental Quality (MDEQ) Actions
In Response to the
EPA Emergency Administrative Order
Updated: 7/10/2017**

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The EPA Emergency Administrative Order contains 15 overall items to be addressed by MDEQ. This update includes status only on items for which progress was made in the last week. It is anticipated that the next update to this summary will be provided on Monday, July 17, 2017.

DETAILED INFORMATION:

- Item 54 (A): “Existing inventory of homes with lead service lines in Excel or similar format”
 - As of July 10, 2017, 2,181 service lines have been replaced. In addition, 541 copper-to-copper lines have been identified. Please see the [Flint Action Tracker web site](#) under Flint Water for monthly information on the status of service line removal.
- Item 61: Necessary, capable and qualified personnel
 - Fleis and VandenBrink was retained by the City of Flint (City) to assist with the operation of the treatment plant.
- Item 62: City will document and share steps to develop and implement a distribution system water quality optimization plan to MDEQ.
 - The MDEQ received the first payment request for Water Infrastructure Improvements for the Nation (WIIN) funding from the City and plans to pay the City approximately \$2,267, 705 this week. Children’s Health Insurance Program (CHIP) payment for \$589,201 was also being processed.
