

**Summary of Michigan Department of Environmental Quality Actions
In Response to the
United States Environmental Protection Agency Emergency Administrative Order
Updated: 12/11/2017**

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The United State Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Emergency Administrative Order contains 15 overall items to be addressed by the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality (MDEQ). This update includes status only on items for which progress was made in the last week. It is anticipated that the next update to this summary will be provided on Monday, December 18, 2017.

DETAILED INFORMATION:

Paragraph 54: Inventory of homes with lead service lines.

- As of 12/04/2017, the city of Flint (City) had replaced 6,024 service lines and identified 1,266 copper-to-copper lines.

Other:

- On 12/7/2017, the EPA wrote a letter to the DEQ and the City asking the agencies to make efforts to expedite the planning and implementation of critically needed infrastructure improvement projects. The letter was initiated as a result of EPA tracking Water Infrastructure Improvements for the Nation Act (WIIN) expenditures.
