

**Summary of Michigan Department of Environmental Quality Actions
In Response to the
United States Environmental Protection Agency Emergency Administrative Order
Updated: 12/21/2017 - Revised**

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The United State Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Emergency Administrative Order contains 15 overall items to be addressed by the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality (MDEQ). This update includes status only on items for which progress was made in the last week. It is anticipated that the next update to this summary will be provided on Wednesday, January 3, 2018.

Other:

- On 12/12/2017, EPA sent a letter to the Michigan Department of Natural Resources and the City seeking information about next steps for complying with the Emergency Order. This letter was posted online on 12/14/2017 under numerous paragraphs.
- On 12/13/2017, the MDEQ sent a letter to the City regarding interim water quality parameters. This letter was posted under paragraphs 53, 57 and 59 on 12/14/2017.
- On 12/21/2017, the MDEQ issued a press release summarizing residential water testing efforts, as well as testing efforts at schools, day care and elder care facilities. A summary of the 6-month LCR monitoring was also included. The related data for this was placed on the [Taking Action on Flint Water web site](#) under School Testing and Establishment Testing.
