

**Summary of  
Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy  
Actions in Response to the  
United States Environmental Protection Agency  
Emergency Administrative Order  
Updated: 1/12/2021**

**EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:**

The United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) Emergency Administrative Order contains 15 overall items to be addressed by the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy (EGLE). This update includes status only on items for which progress was made in the last week. It is anticipated that the next update to this summary will be provided on Tuesday, January 19, 2021.

Paragraph 53B:

- On January 7, 2021, the city of Flint submitted an amended Lead and Copper Rule Report to include samples submitted from two sites just before the start of the new year. This brought the total number of sets of samples to 174. These two sites have been identified as having a copper service line and, therefore, do not affect the previous calculation for the 90<sup>th</sup> percentile. Only because they were collected within the monitoring period they must be identified in the report.
