MICHIGAN BOARD OF OCCUPATIONAL THERAPISTS RULES COMMITTEE WORK GROUP MEETING MINUTES OCTOBER 21, 2020

The Michigan Board of Occupational Therapists Rules Committee Work Group, met on October 21, 2020. The meeting was held via Zoom.

CALL TO ORDER

Ditschman informed the Board there was one public comment to rule R 338.1252.

Bethany Burge, MS, OTR/L, CNP, CAPS, commented that the existing language in the rules that allowed for "live and synchronous" continuing education (CE) courses allows for greater flexibility for completing CEs into the future. Utilizing platforms such as Zoom, Google Meet, and other electronic services that allow for virtual "in person" participation may become especially important during and immediately post pandemic to maintain professional certification (2021-beyond). It is unfortunate it will be rescinded in favor of "live and in person" however, if the Governor's Orders can supersede these rules, perhaps it's not necessarily an issue.

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The Rules Committee agreed with the comment to delete "in person" due to the amount of CE that is being offered online in an interactive format, and the difficulty of finding CE that is "in person." The Rules Committee suggested the rule read "live, synchronous, and interactive." This also requires a modification to (1)(a) to clarify that the limitation of not more than 10 CE hours earned during a 24-hour period applies to hours that are asynchronous and not interactive.
