

NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

The Michigan Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs (LARA), Bureau of Fire Services (Bureau), Storage Tank Division, will conduct a public hearing on proposed administrative rules promulgated pursuant to Part 211, Underground Storage Tank Regulations, of the Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act, 1994 PA 451, as amended (Act 451); R 29.2107, and R 29.2108. The proposed rule package addresses federally mandated rule changes to the underground storage tank rules and is intended to bring Michigan into compliance with these mandates.

The public hearing will be held on January 11, 2018, at 9:00 a.m. The public hearing will be held at the Bureau Office in Conference Room B, at 3101 Technology Blvd, Lansing, Michigan 48909.

These rules will become effective seven days after filing with the Secretary of State.
