The terms of the limitation require that for the first year, Petitioner's practice as a pharmacist must be under direct, onsite supervision of a Board-approved supervising pharmacist. The second and third year of limitation, Petitioner's practice as a pharmacist must be under general supervision of a Board-approved supervising pharmacist. In addition, during the limitation period, Petitioner is prohibited from working or holding any employment position as a pharmacist-in-charge or owning a pharmacy. Petitioner is required to petition for reclassification. Petitioner is placed on probation, to run concurrently with the period of limitation with required quarterly supervisor reports.
