MOTION PREVAILED

Board Review Panel

Tseng reported that the Board Review Panel met prior to the Board meeting to discuss continuing education requirements for those that are currently under discipline and how to make the reviews of that documentation more consistent. Discussion was held regarding contacting the University of Michigan or the University of Detroit Mercy to design custom programs for disciplined individuals with continuing education deficiencies. The Board Review Panel also discussed the possibility of being able to provide extensions to disciplined individuals who need to complete continuing education.

Tseng stated that discussion was held regarding the Board Review Panel having the ability to ask for more information on a complaint before authorizing an investigation.

RDH Committee

Weidig stated that the RDH Committee met prior to the Board meeting. She stated that the RDH Committee wanted to make sure that CODA protocols and standards were being met, when issuing licenses to new graduates, in order to continue to protect the public. CODA protocols and standards also apply to licensure by endorsement.

Rules Committee

Ditschman stated that the public hearing for Dental Therapists has not yet been scheduled. She indicated that she was waiting on clarifying language from the Department at which time the promulgation process will continue.

PA 161 Update

Erin Suddeth, RDH, BS, MPA, with MDHHS-Oral Health, reported that they currently have 53 programs including 153 supervising dentists, 268 dental hygienists, and 160 dental assistants.

Continuing Education Waiver Request

MOTION by Brown, seconded by Hale, to discuss.

Department Update

Ditschman recommended that the Board members review, at a minimum, Executive Orders 2020-13, 2020-17, 2020-21 (now 2020-42), and 2020-30, which are all relevant to the practice of dentistry.

Ditschman stated that licensees renewing during the emergency declaration will not be required to provide proof of continuing education. She stated that work related to COVID-19 will count towards the continuing education requirements. She stated that continuing education audits are not being run at this time.

Ditschman stated that renewals for cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR), that fall during the emergency declaration, will not be required until after the emergency declaration is no longer in effect.

Ditschman stated that the Criminal Background Checks are still required for licensure as there are available locations where this can be completed.

Ditschman stated that there is a temporary waiver on exam requirements for licensure if the examinations are not being offered. Individuals who have applied for licensure on, or after, March 10, 2020, who meet all requirements for licensure except for examination, will be issued a license that will be good for 6 months. These licensees will have six months, from the end of the emergency declaration, to provide proof of having completed the required exam, or the license will become null and void.

Clewley clarified that the change of expiration dates, to the initial license issue date on licenses, began with the transition to MiPLUS. The continuing education is the same for an individual whose license is extended beyond the three years, due to initial issue date, as it is for those who have an actual three-year license.

Smith asked for Board members to check their email and to make sure that they have responded to the Attorney General's office regarding the waiver of service in the Tedder's litigation.
