Firefighter I & II Training Academy

The 2020 Allegan County Fire Academy includes all the following courses:

Firefighter I & II / HazMat Ops - A25E

The Firefighter I & II course is structured for competency-based group instruction using curriculum from Jones and Bartlett, Fundamentals of Firefighter Skills: Evidence -Based Practices, Enhanced Fourth Edition. The curriculum addresses the training objectives covered in the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) standard 1001, 2013 Edition. This new A25E course incorporates the HazMat Operations into the academy and is tested with the Firefighter I & II exam.

Incident Command & Resource Management for the Fire Services – L13B

This two-day program provides students with an understanding of the Incident Command System (ICS) and resource management for the fire service and then application in both emergency and non-emergency situations. This course addresses the need for ICS, an overview of the structure and flexibility of ICS, an understanding of the command skills necessary to function effectively in an ICS structure and the need to effectively manage your resources. This course meets the requirements of ICS-100 and ICS-200.

<u>Drivers Training (VFIS) – B05C</u>

The driver training course includes items which address the attitude and knowledge of the potential emergency vehicle driver while responding to an emergency as well as an understanding of the emergency vehicle driver's responsibility during non-emergency situations.

Vehicle Extrication - K01B

This course is designed to provide Fire Fighters with a better understanding of the current techniques available for the swift extrication of victims from a variety of vehicle entrapments.

Advanced Vehicle Stabilization - K02A

This course is designed to provide Fire Fighters with a better understanding of the current techniques available for the stabilization of vehicles for a variety of vehicle entrapments.

Courage to be Safe - Everyone Goes Home - G11A

This course is a provocative and moving presentation by the National Fallen Firefighters Foundation, through the Everyone Goes Home® Program, that is designed to change the culture of accepting the loss of firefighters as a normal occurrence.

\$250.00 per student non-refundable registration fee (includes textbooks), due no later than 12/15/2019 Per the State Fire Marshal Memo, departments that are not compliant with the National Fire Incident Reporting System (NFIRS) will be responsible for additional fees. This fee is currently estimated at \$1,500.00 per student.
