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Chairman Deloney called the hearings to order at 10:06 a.m., noting a quorum was present.

1. Moved by Commissioner Olshove, supported by Commissioner Quimby, that the minutes of the Southfield Appeal Hearing of April 25, 2013, be approved as written and presented, motion carried by unanimous vote.
2. Schoolcraft Family Market, Inc., D/B/A Butcher Boys Food Market, 18700 Schoolcraft, Detroit, Wayne County Request ID# 669347

The licensing hearing was conducted for Schoolcraft Family Market, Inc., Request ID# 669347, which was tabled from the hearings held on March 14, 2013. Susan Moody appeared on behalf of the Attorney Generals Office, Attorney Thomas J. Giachino, and Wael W. Maroke, stockholder, appeared on behalf of the applicant. Ms. Moody and Mr. Giachino offered comments regarding this case. After discussion on the record, Chairman Deloney made a motion to affirm the previous Commission Order of denial dated January 30, 2013, as set forth in the Licensing Appeal Order, and to deny the transfer ownership of 2013 Specially Designated Distributor license, only, with Sunday Sales Permit (P.M) from Memo, Inc., and transfer location, to be held in conjunction with existing 2013 Specially Designated Merchant license with Sunday Sales Permit (A.M). Commissioner Olshove supported, and the motion was carried by unanimous vote.

3. Cantoro Café LLC, 15550 Haggerty, Northville, Northville Township, Wayne County Request ID# 532842

The church hearing was conducted for Cantoro Café LLC, Request ID# 532842. Susan Moody appeared on behalf of the Attorney Generals Office, Attorney Americo Fernandez and member, Mario Fallone, appeared on behalf of the

applicant. Pastor Jim Howard appeared on behalf of the objecting church, Metropolitan Seventh Day Adventist Church and Junior Academy. Ms. Moody, Mr. Fernandez, Mr. Fallone and Pastor Howard offered comments regarding this case. After discussion on the record, Chairman Deloney advised the findings of the Commission are as follows: that The Metropolitan Seventh Day Adventist Church and Junior Academy, did file a proper objection to the request for a new Specially Designated Distributor license with new Sunday Sales Permit (P.M.) to be held in conjunction with new Specially Designated Merchant license with On-Premise Seating at above location, the Commission, under administrative rule R 436.1959, determined that the applicant had the burden of proceeding and had to show by competent, material and substantial evidence that a waiver of MCL 436.1503 would NOT adversely impact the operation of the objecting church, and that the applicant and the objecting church presented witnesses at the hearing for the purposes of providing testimony at the hearing. Chairman Deloney made a motion that based on the findings of the Commission, it is concluded that the applicant has shown by competent, material and substantial evidence that a waiver of MCL 436.1503 would NOT adversely impact the operation of the objecting church, and the request will continue through the licensing process. Supported by Commissioner Olshove, motion carried by unanimous vote.

With no further business, moved by Commissioner Olshove, supported by Commissioner Quimby, that the Appeal Hearings be adjourned at 11:22 a.m., motion carried by unanimous vote.
