I. CALL TO ORDER AND DETERMINATION OF QUORUM:

Chairperson James called the meeting to order at 1:15 p.m. A quorum was determined present.

II. REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF AGENDA:

17-10-001

A MOTION was made by Councilperson Hondorp and seconded by Councilperson Pettinger to approve the meeting agenda for October 27, 2017, as presented. MOTION CARRIED.

III. REVIEW AND APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

17-10-002

A MOTION was made by Councilperson Blomstrom and seconded by Councilperson Hondorp to approve the August 8, 2017, regular meeting minutes as presented. MOTION CARRIED.

V. STATE FIRE MARSHAL'S REPORT:

GovDelivery: Fire Marshal Sehlmeyer encouraged all attendees to sign up for GovDelivery. Through GovDelivery, the Bureau of Fire Services (BFS) staff will share training opportunities and other official notices from the Fire Marshal's office. The Fire Marshal also asked that anyone submitting a "Q" course application provide a flyer to advertise the training through GovDelivery. To subscribe, please visit the BFS website (www.michigan.gov/bfs).

Training Coordinators: The Fire Marshal, along with Deputy Director Ann Searles, recently conducted training coordinator interviews for Fiscal Year 2018 (FY18). A total of 26 training coordinators were selected for FY18. All FY18 training coordinators will be required to attend an eight-hour training session. The Fire Marshal is also looking to increase communication with the training coordinators over the next year and plans to begin hosting regularly scheduled conference calls.

Funding: The Fire Marshal reported that at the end of Fiscal Year 2017 (FY17), the remaining balance of the fireworks safety fund was \$2,237.40. The Fire Marshal, with the help of BFS staff (Hollie Metts, Dan Hammerberg, TJ Richardson and Ann Searles), scheduled approximately \$300,000.00 in training for firefighters statewide using unencumbered FY17 funds. The Fire Marshal encouraged all attendees to work with their county training committee chairpersons to make sure that their allocated funding is spent in FY18. At a minimum, each county received \$15,000.00 for training.

Pending Legislation: The Fire Marshal reported that Senate Bills (SB) 264 and 265 have passed both the Senate and the House and have been forwarded to the Governor's Office for signature. Both bills are tied to Public Act 291 of 1966, the Firefighters Training Council Act. If approved: two (2) members will be added to the Michigan Fire Fighters Training Council; the Fire Marshal will be allowed to grant reciprocity for any certification (currently, the Fire Marshal may only grant reciprocity for Firefighter I, Firefighter II and Department of Defense certifications); a minimum number continuing education credits will be required; and funding will be tied to monthly fire reporting.

NFIRS: Currently, about 25% of departments are not reporting consistently. Any department that requires assistance with their monthly NFIRS reports should contact NFIRS Program Manager Rhonda Howard at NFIRS@michigan.gov.

MIOSHA: The Fire Marshal recently met with Bart Pickelman, Director of MIOSHA. Both agree that MIOSHA and the fire service need to do a better job of working together. In an effort to do so the MIOSHA staff are developing a checklist for inspections.

Community Risk Reduction Program: Upon his appointment, the Fire Marshal was tasked with reducing the number of fire related deaths in Michigan. As such, the Fire Marshal has put together a community risk reduction task force to undertake this assignment. A strategic planning session was held on September 7, 2017, at the Michigan State Police HazMat Training Center. At the end of the strategic planning session, the members drafted the 3-year strategic and operational plans. The Fire Marshal shared that the draft plans were approved by the Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs and that the plans will be launched on November 1, 2017. On October 30 and 31, 2017, the Fire Marshal also shared that the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) will be conducting a CRR pilot program in East Lansing.

Following a presentation from Chief Mark Cleveland at the September 26, 2017 Curriculum Committee Meeting, the consensus of the Curriculum Committee was to recommend that the MFFTC approve the Fire Instructor II Train-the-Trainer program as presented.

A MOTION was made by Councilperson Blomstrom and seconded by Councilperson Pettinger to approve the Fire Instructor II Train-the-Trainer program as presented. MOTION CARRIED.

a. Instructor I Passing Score

On September 26, 2017, the Curriculum Committee discussed returning the Instructor I passing score to 80%. The Instructor I pass rate had been scheduled to drop to 70% at the beginning of the new fiscal year on October 1, 2017. The recommendation of the Curriculum Committee is to return the Instructor I pass rate to 80% as there was no Instructor II program in place when the motion was made to lower the pass rate.

A MOTION was made by Councilperson Blomstrom and seconded by Councilperson Pettinger to return the Instructor I pass rate to 80% effective November 1, 2017, which would REVERSE MOTION 17-2-005 from February 14, 2017. Councilperson Hondorp questioned if there had been any Instructor I exams since the pass rate had been changed. Region Coordinator TJ Richardson confirmed that there had been two (2) exams since however, the exams has been scored with an 80% pass rate. Mr. Richardson recommended that the MFFTC make the Instructor I pass rate retroactive to the beginning of Fiscal Year 2018 on October 1, 2017.

Councilperson Blomstrom requested to amend the motion to return the Instructor I pass rate to 80% effective October 1, 2017. The amended motion was seconded by Councilperson Pettinger. The MOTION CARRIED AS AMENDED.

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b. Fire Officer III Equivalencies

On September 26, 2017, the Curriculum Committee reviewed Leadership Programs I, II and III, realizing that the National Fire Academy (NFA) no longer supports these programs. It is the recommendation of the Curriculum Committee that the current leadership programs correlate with the following new NFA programs to allow individuals to complete their fire officer program without having access to the old classes:

Leadership I – Professional Growth Leadership II – Perspectives in Thinking Leadership III – Frameworks to Success

A MOTION was made by Councilperson Blomstrom and seconded by Councilperson Pettinger to approve the Fire Office III equivalencies as recommended. MOTION CARRIED.

c. Distance Education Proposal

Jonathan Stone

Due to limited training resources and geographical challenges in the UP, Jonathan Stone has proposed a Distance Education Program to better train students and overcome these challenges. The Distance Education Program would be based out of Houghton County and would web conference to two (2) distance sites in Ontonagon and Baraga Counties. A training coordinator would be present when the students sign-in to the web conference and would route any questions back to the host site. The practical portion of the program would take place in eight-hour blocks twice per month and would rotate between the different host departments. The students would be assigned online reading assignments from the Jones and Bartlett textbook and would take quizzes and tests covering the material. Region Coordinator Dan Hammerberg shared that EMS Divisions have been using his training model for several years and have had good results. Fire Marshal Sehlmeyer proposes that Mr. Stone run a pilot program in the Western UP and provide monthly progress reports to Mr. Hammerberg. If the pilot program is successful, the Fire Marshal would consider extending the Distance Education Program to other areas. Councilperson Pettinger questioned the total number of hours of the program. Mr. Stone assured that the program would meet the required 244 hours.

17-10-006

d. "Q" Class Applications: Fire Marshal Sehlmeyer shared that every county received a minimum of \$15,000.00 at the beginning of FY18. The Fire Marshal cautioned applicants that as courses are approved, funding will be approved only if county funds are available as the BFS does not have any funding available to approve non-county funds at this time. The Fire Marshal also shared that a revised Q Course County Training Fund Application was added to the BFS website.
