READING SMOKE AND RESIDENTIAL TACTICS

The Kalkaska County Training Committee is pleased to present the course, **Reading Smoke and Residential Tactics**. This course explores the characteristics of smoke color, density and velocity in order to identify cues necessary to developing a safe, strategic fire ground incident action plan. These observations made during the initial size-up will assist the fire ground incident commander in being pro-active in determining the mode of operation while keeping in mind the survivability index of the interior and the three incident priorities of Life Safety, Incident Stabilization and Property Conservation. Using these lessons learned students will explore various fire attack options including the establishment of a traditional Offensive/Defensive attack, implementation of SLICER-VS, Offensive Exterior Operations as well as exploring transitional options. Concepts are delivered through an interactive PPT/Video, lecture/discussion.
