

#### REPORT AUTHORITY

Public Act 368 of 1978

MCL 333.20162

- (8) Beginning October 1, 2005, the director of the department shall submit a report by December 1 of each year to the standing committees and appropriations subcommittees of the senate and house of representatives concerned with public health issues. The director shall include all of the following information in the report concerning the preceding fiscal year:
- (a) The number of initial applications the department received and completed within the 6-month time period required under subsection (1).
  - (b) The number of applications requiring a request for additional information.
  - (c) The number of applications denied.
  - (d) The average processing time for initial licenses granted after the 6-month period.
  - (e) The number of temporary permits issued under subsection (3).
- (f) The number of initial license applications not issued within the 6-month period and the amount of money returned to applicants under subsection (3).

#### **DEPARTMENT OVERVIEW**

LARA is composed of agencies and commissions that promote business growth and job creation through streamlined, simple, fair, and efficient regulation, while at the same time protect the health and safety of Michigan's citizens.

Formed July 6, 2015, the Bureau of Community and Health Systems (BCHS) serves to protect and assure safe, effective, efficient and accessible community and health care services delivered by state licensed and federally certified providers in Michigan.

The Bureau is responsible for state licensing of facilities, agencies and programs under the Public Health Code, Mental Health Code, Adult Foster Care Facility Licensing Act, and Child Care Organizations Act. The Bureau is also the State Agency responsible for conducting certification activities on behalf of the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) to assure that covered health providers and suppliers meet federal conditions to participate in the Medicare and Medicaid programs.

In general, the majority of state licensing activities involve the issuance and renewal of licenses to qualified facilities, agencies, and programs; conducting initial, routine and revisit inspections to determine compliance with state and federal requirements; and investigating complaints against state licensed and federally certified providers.



#### REPORT OVERVIEW

For purposes of this report, the bureau oversees the licensing of inpatient psychiatric hospitals/units as defined in the Public Health Code.

MCL 333.20104 (7) "Freestanding surgical outpatient facility" means a facility, other than the office of a physician, dentist, podiatrist, or other private practice office, offering a surgical procedure and related care that in the opinion of the attending physician can be safely performed without requiring overnight inpatient hospital care.

MCL 333.20106 (4) "Hospice" means a health care program that provides a coordinated set of services rendered at home or in outpatient or institutional settings for individuals suffering from a disease or condition with a terminal prognosis.

MCL 333.20106 (5) "Hospital" means a facility offering inpatient, overnight care, and services for observation, diagnosis, and active treatment of an individual with a medical, surgical, obstetric, chronic, or rehabilitative condition requiring the daily direction or supervision of a physician.

MCL 333.20109. (1) "Nursing home" means a nursing care facility, including a county medical care facility, that provides organized nursing care and medical treatment to 7 or more unrelated individuals suffering or recovering from illness, injury, or infirmity. As used in this subsection, "medical treatment" includes treatment by an employee or independent contractor of the nursing home who is an individual licensed or otherwise authorized to engage in a health profession under part 170 or 175.
