IV. COMMUNICATIONS:

Councilperson Steichen: Mentioned that he has received a lot of feedback about people excited and looking forward to the upcoming Fire Service Expo.

Fire Marshal Sehlmeyer: Received a meeting request on November 7, 2020 regarding St. Clair Shores firefighters concerns regarding officer reciprocity. A virtual meeting is in the process of being scheduled.

V. STATE FIRE MARSHAL'S REPORT:

a) BFS Move: The Bureau of Fire Services no longer resides at 3101 Technology Boulevard. BFS has moved to 611 W. Ottawa Street in downtown Lansing. Currently the building is not open to

the general public and a majority of State workers are working from home until January 2nd, 2021.

- b) COVID-19 Updates: Fire Marshal Sehlmeyer informed everyone about <u>Senate Bill 1108</u> that was signed by Governor Whitmer (making it now Public Act 228 of 2020), which allows council to continue meeting virtually.
- c) Legislative Updates
 - 1) HB 4792 Unattended Fueling
 - 2) HB 6148 O'Malley Bill to amend PA 390 of 1976, the Emergency Management Act
- d) Fire Officer I and Fire Officer II Overview: Fire Marshal conveyed that BFS has received feedback from the Train-the-Trainers has been positive. Currently there have been 7 sessions with more being scheduled in the future. Those who have taken the Train-the-Trainer will be able to teach Fire Officer I and Fire Officer II. Once the instructors have gone through the Train-the-Trainer, they have to go to the Jones & Bartlett Navigate site and complete all 14 chapter quizzes so they can familiarize themselves with what the students will be expected to do. Fire Marshal also informed everyone that if anyone is having issues with the Jones & Bartlett navigate site, they need to contact Jones & Bartlett, not the Bureau of Fire Services.
- e) FY20 Grant Report Summary (Handout): Fire Marshal updated council on the status of fiscal year 2020 grants. Almost all of the departments claimed their grants. The grant program has been successful, but it has been an interesting year, we got a fair amount of money back from some of the grants due to some departments not being able to carry out the purpose of their grant. We did utilize both lists that were made in February.
- f) Wednesday Wrap-Up: These will continue bi-weekly on Wednesdays through December. Currently they are scheduled for November 18th, December 2nd, and 16th at 4:00 pm. There will be an additional Wednesday Wrap-Up at 7:00pm on December 2nd. This past Wrap-Up Governor Whitmer was on the call and if you are following on social media, you saw that she did six videos for MI Prevention. Those videos are available for fire departments to use on their social media, just reach out to Kymberly Pashkowsky who is running the MI Prevention program and she can get you those videos. Those videos include over all fire deaths, smoking, cooking, heating equipment, and even one on Christmas decorations. Our governor has clearly come out in support of MI Prevention and community risk reduction. We also have a lot of public service announcement items that are coming out from MI Prevention that should be able to keep your social media platform full.
- g) 2020 Fatal Fires: As of Sunday (11/9/2020) there have been a total of 100 fatal fires. We are 10% above year to date of where we were in 2019 (102) but the state is below where we were in 2018. We will continue to do the messaging and the outreach based on what we are learning from each one of these fires when we get the fatal fire reports back. Fire Marshal gave a shout out to Trevor Slater from the Michigan State Police (MSP) who oversees the Fire Investigation Unit. MSP has started using the Fatal Fire Form and submitting it online which has been a huge help in getting the data in as quickly as possible. Fire Marshal also gave a shout out to Kyle Svoboda at Plainfield Fire who manages the collection of data and Kurtis Gear who created the MI Prevention app. We could not do the work we do without them. Fire Marshal also took the opportunity to congratulate councilmember Aileen Pettinger for winning the Firemen Larry Fire Educator award from the Michigan Fire Inspector Society. She was sighted for the great work she has been doing for the Sound Off program. Great work by the Saginaw Fire Department.
- h) Revised Course Summary (*Handouts*): Fire marshal provided council with handouts for FY21 and let them know that since we are only five weeks in to fiscal year 2021, there have not been a lot of tests, so there will not be much data, but we thought it was important that council had the handout.
- i) Draft FFTC Rules Update: The Draft FFTC Rules have been approved by the Regulatory Affairs Officer. The next step is for the bureau to prepare the Regulatory Impact Statement (RIS) and Cost Benefit Analysis. Then the RIS/Cost Benefit Analysis goes to Michigan Office of

Administrative Hearings and Rules (MOAHR) for approval and MOAHR notifies JCAR. Once approved, we can begin scheduling the public hearing. For a breakdown of the rulemaking process click here.

VI. CURRICULUM WORK GROUP REPORT:

Councilperson Blomstrom conveyed that the next order of business for the curriculum committee will be updating the Driver's Training test. McNeil has stated that the new test and materials will be out in December. Once the materials are in hand, we can look to see about updating the current test. Other than that, we are waiting for the fire marshal to choose the next curriculum to look at besides drivers training. Fire Marshal Sehlmeyer informed Councilperson Blomstrom that the next curriculum will be Fire Officer II and we are currently working on developing that exam. We are doing our best to be able to get it in by the end of the year.

VIII. NEW BUSINESS:

- a) Draft Rules to Michigan Office Of Administrative Hearings and Rules (MOAHR): Fire Marshal Sehlmeyer mentioned he already covered the new business in his report.
- b) FY21 Grants: Fire Marshal Sehlmeyer initiated conversation regarding what council would like to do next year with the grant monies that comes back from counties. One of the things to look at is how we are going to distribute the money going forward. While the current process works. the Bureau of Fire Services spend 20-30 hours a month throughout the rest of the year managing that program. The Rules state that after December 31st, the money comes back to the council and the council gets to disperse it. Is there a better way to redistribute that money after January 1st? Do we need to look at putting the money into a big project, a couple projects? We need to look at the process to distribute that. Councilperson Steichen mentioned to have some type of lottery system. Dialogue was had among council members that departments would have to be sure to be NFIRS compliant, adhered to all the grant rules previously and not been awarded a grant in the last 2-3 years in order to put in for the lottery process. Fire Marshal Sehlmeyer also mentioned that someone proposed all the counties that did not turn in money have the money that was returned be spilt up between them. So if your county turned in money you are not eligible for the redistribution. The issue with that, is that we get money returned all year long. Fire Marshal proposed the idea of using the funds to help put facilities to address Live Fire training across the state. Dialogue was had among council members. Councilperson Pettinger brought forth that she has been approached about behavioral health. With the stressors from this field and with Covid, she suggested group or peer support that has been done in the past. Mental health is as important as live firing training. Chairperson Tackett suggested to the fire marshal that a one page plan be made to present to council at the December meeting regarding the redistribution of funds.
- c) Shiawassee County Live Fire Training Seminar: Bill Pawluk sent in a letter with the results of the grant that was given to Shiawassee County to do five Live Fire training days at Lansing Community College. The feedback from the training was positive and a good regional outreach opportunity.

IX. PUBLIC COMMENT:

Rob Ginther, Beverly Hills Public Safety: Commends council and apologized for the one unsigned Q course application. He will resubmit the application for the December agenda. Thanks council.

Tim Seal, North Oakland County Fire Authority: There are a vast array of approved Q courses that are training outside of basic training. Would recommend council considers the amount of maximum allowed for each council funded course that is already a council curriculum. Some of the funding falls well short of the actual cost for running the class. Council should reevaluate the course catalog and look at the hours and make sure that council is on par with the fees and the hours associated with the practical skills. Would like to see the fireworks funds try to fully fund the courses so we can put them out there for free for anyone who wants to be trained.

Dave Feichtner, Springfield Twp. Fire Department: Echoes some of Tim's comments. It makes sense both with retention and logically, that we, moving forward in our training plan, plan on fully funding every recruit school, driver's training, and hazmat that happens throughout the state, that that should be our primary focus with initial education and then ensure that ongoing education happens. But if we cannot fully fund all the recruit schools that are underfunded, if we did some sort of study and found out the actual cost of a Fire I & II class is, we will see they are underfunded and we should focus on making sure that the class is funded as well as all the additional instructors it takes.

Jon Stone, Stanton Twp. Fire Department: Wanted to highlight that if we do move in the direction of the mobile live fire that would make an ideal regional AFG Request at the state level. Thinks we

can leverage the MFFTC SMOKE money in order to make that happen. Having live fire training enhances recruitment, enances the quality of training, and it really enhances continuing education training by allowing people to come back in and work on their skills. I think this would show our statewide commitment and Michigan as a leader nationally in our programming, especially for fire training. I think that would be innovative and other states might take notice of what we're doing as well.

Jack White, Shelby-Benona Fire Department: Piggy backed off Jon's statement. About 12 years ago, his county wrote an AFG Grant for a mobile live fire training unit. Have had it for 12 years and has proved to be a useful tool.

Matt Majestic, Oakland Community College: The other thing to keep in mind, is that the live fire mobile unit is not just a one time purchase, there are upkeep costs and insurance associated with it.

X. COUNCIL COMMENT:

Councilperson Tackett: Thanks everybody. I'm not going to sit here and reiterate what everyone said. There were a lot of good points and a lot of good discussion. I'll end it with Happy Thanksgiving to everyone and your families and hopes everyone is being safe and healthy this season.

Councilperson Blomstrom: Looking forward to the next meeting and discussing live fire training and behavioral mental health. I am in favor of maybe having a special work session before the meeting so we can throw that out there. I do want to speak to Tim and Dave, I think you are spot on when it comes to the funding. If you remember last December at the Instructors conference, I made a 3 point proposal on how to increase the funding for Firefighter I & II based on a student ratio of 15, 20, and 25. That was voted down by council, I have no problem bringing it back, I have to find out how I can bring back a motion like that once it has been voted on. I can try to work on that also for December but I will need to try to figure out how to do another motion that doesn't mimic my last one a year ago but has the ability to be looked at again by council. Happy Thanksgiving.

Councilperson Styles: We all do need to sit down and go back to look for some ideas for the way to do the grants. I strive hard on mental health and I have had people request for me to do my class because people are struggling. We also have to take a look at live fire and the long term, whats it going to take to fulfill it. Other than that I wish everyone to stay safe and healthy. Please follow the social distancing orders. I don't want to see anyone getting sick from it.

Councilperson White: Agree with what Chief Styles just said also and what Jake had said there is no way we are going to be able to come up with something that is going to be perfect for every fire department in the state, but we will do our best. I will look into different things and will be back in December to discuss them. Wished everyone a Happy Thanksgiving.

Councilperson Blackmer: A quick question for the fire marshal. I saw that we set another record on Covid cases. Do we expect that we are going to be able to continue our fire academies and classes or are we expecting that we should prepare to start to slow things down, similar to what happened last year? Fire marshal responded, I think realistically you should start looking at that. I think the cases continue to grow; I think one of the things that, as a council, we shared that virtual was an option. You still have to do the 16, 8 hour days if you are doing the hands on but any time we can split up the class in half, use the J&B learning platform to eliminate large gatherings but I do see where we are going to have to be more flexible in the future.

Councilperson Janik: Grateful for the volume of attendance online. It really shows great interest. Looks forward to the December meeting. I think the behavioral health and live fire training have real merit to them and are worthy of our time to look in to in depth and help with Kevin on finding out which way to go

Councilperson Steichen: Wanted to highlight how awesome it is to be a firefighter right now. The level of engagement and the amount of communication and the statewide coordination is amazing. I tuned in to a couple of the Wednesday Wrap-Up's in the last few months and see a lot of the same names and faces on these meetings. What everybody is doing is good and the fire service is

benefitting from it, whether we feel it or not. I do encourage everybody to reach out to their CTC's and make sure all monies are encumbered so we do not have to worry about to spend the money come January 1. If the money does come in, I believe council will find a great way to spend it and live fire and behavioral health are a very high priority for all of us. I will be sending the fire marshal my opinions on both of these and I look for anyone in Northern Michigan or Michigan in general to email me or call me and let me know your opinion, so I can mesh them all together in an email to the fire marshal.

Councilperson Pettinger: Appreciates everyone's input today. I am encouraged that the rules are already progressing pretty quickly. In regard to these grants, the reason I brought it up is because in my own department we've had maydays and while I think live fire training, we definitely need it, we also need to be mentally fit to fight fires. I will definitely encourage anyone to email me or call me with advice for live fire information. I will be researching both that and behavioral health and come back in December and offer some more input. Everyone have a Happy Thanksgiving and stay safe with Covid. It's not going away, please wear your mask.

Fire Marshal Sehlmeyer: Asks that we look at doing a work session the morning of the December 4th meeting. Would like to take some time to talk about FF I&II funding on that morning if we can. One of the things we should wrap our heads around is that we are giving every county \$17,500.00 now and we want to make sure we cover Firefighter I&II, Driver's Training, HazMat Ops, but that \$17,500.00 is probably not enough. Do we look at changing what each county gets? Would like anyone with suggestions to help provide solutions to reach out and engage with council members. I also want to share this; our office has received a number of complaints or constructive criticism regarding the students that got caught up in the academy last year when Covid hit. They felt that they were rushed through the hands on part where they did not get the skills they needed. We have to think about how we are going to do the hands on part going forward. I have a meeting at the end of the month with the County Training Chairpersons. The idea is to talk with them on how they collaborate, so they do not have to turn money in. Thank you to council for working with us, especially when we had to cancel the meetings while we waited on the ruling from the executive orders and stay healthy, stay safe.

I just wanted to provide information about a few of the agenda items for today's meeting in advance so members have the ability to prepare and ask questions.

1) Adoption of the Health and Safety Program Manager Course

The Health and Safety Program Manager Course (F0722) is scheduled in Muskegon County in January 2021. The class is currently full with 25 people. Since the previous Health and Safety Officer course has been eliminated, I am requesting this course be added to the course catalog and made available to Instructor Is who successfully complete the course. Also, by adding it into SMOKE prior to the NFA arriving, the BFS will have a record of who took the initial offering and could instruct it in the future.

2) Sunset of the Health and Safety Officer Course

This course is no longer supported by the NFA and has been eliminated, replaced by the Health and Safety Program Manager course. I am requesting this course be "deactivated" in our course system.

3) Updated Course Code for the McNeil Driver's Training Program (new version)

This can be moved to Old Business now, as the updated Driver's Training program was set to be released around the Instructor's Conference – however, that did not happen. When the new program is finally released, I will be requesting an updated course code for the overall class, and a course code for the newest Train-the-Trainer. As of the date of this memo, the course has not been finalized yet – I am hoping to have this ready to go in February 2021.

4) Updating ICS 300/400 Courses in Course Catalog (I15A and I16A)

The newest manuals for ICS 300 and ICS 400 were released in April 2019. Since that time, FEMA offered online updates and exams to "recertify" instructors to the new curriculum. In December 2019, FEMA disbanded their recertification program, turning it over to the Michigan State Police. During this calendar year, the MSP has been working with individuals to recertify their ICS 300 and 400 credentials. A joint memo from the BFS and the MSP was posted over GovDelivery about the updates and need to recertify as well. After the instructors are recertified, they are given the newest edition of the instructional materials.

At this point, in looking at the instructor lists in SMOKE, of the 32 instructors for 300 and 400, 10 instructors have recertified and are eligible to instruct the course.

I am requesting the old ICS 300 and 400 course codes be deactivated, and have new course codes for the classes correlating to the April 2019 newest curriculum. The ten instructors from the previous BFS instructor list who have recertified through the MSP or FEMA would be placed on the newest instructor list. If additional original instructors decide to recertify, they could also be added to the list in the future.

Due to the fact I help the Michigan State Police coordinate these programs, if the Council Chairperson feels I should abstain from voting on this motion, I have no problem doing so.

5) Increasing Funding for Firefighter I and II programs

During public comment at the last MFFTC meeting, it was mentioned about the need to increase funding for Firefighter I and II programs in order to assist with compensating additional instructors to meet a 5:1 student-to-instructor ratio. In December 2019, I proposed a motion to have a three-tiered system of class compensation, based on the number of students. That particular motion failed, and I do not believe I can bring the same motion (and the same numbers) back to Council for additional discussion. However, the same problem still exists; I believe I can request a remedy again, but using different numbers in the motion.

The main problem is that \$16,225 does not adequately compensate academies for payroll, supplies, and needed items for class. The funding mechanism in SMOKE needs to be increased above \$16,225 so counties have the ability to fund academies above their \$17,500 utilizing other county fireworks funding. Currently, once the \$16,225 limit is reached, departments are forced to pay cash to cover the rest of the balance of the course – this can be difficult for departments with very minimal training budgets.

I am hoping to have good discussion about solving this issue. To start the discussion process, I am requesting the course cap be raised to \$20,000 in SMOKE for a Firefighter I and II/FRO program. We would also need to decide what an individual Firefighter I and an individual Firefighter II program course cap would need to be if they are increased as well.
