Enclosed, please find your next update of the Michigan Liquor Control Code, Administrative Rules and Related Laws. The pages included herein replace those already present in your book. The following provides a brief review of the changes that have occurred since your last update:

- MICHIGAN LIQUOR CONTROL CODE AMENDMENT – BYO WINE
 - (HB-5046) P.A. 235 of 2013, Effective March 14, 2014.
 - Amends MCL 436.2021 (Section 102)
 - This law amends the Michigan Liquor Control Code to authorize an on-premises licensee to allow the consumption of wine brought into the licensed premises by a consumer.
- MICHIGAN LIQUOR CONTROL CODE AMENDMENT - CONDITIONAL LIQUOR LICENSURE
 - (HB-4277) P.A. 236 of 2013, Effective May 22, 2014 subject to the passage of HB 4709'13, HB 4710'13, HB 4711'13, SB 0504'13, SB 0505'13, SB 0506'13, SB 0507'13, SB 0650'13, SB 0651'13.
 - Amends MCL 436.1525 (Section 525)
 - This law amends the Michigan Liquor Control Code to provide for the issuance of a conditional liquor license.
- MICHIGAN LIQUOR CONTROL CODE AMENDMENT – SDD LICENSE TRANSFER PROVISIONS
 - (HB-5140) P.A. 237 of 2013, Effective December 26, 2013.
 - Amends MCL 436.1531 (Section 531)
 - This law amends the Michigan Liquor Control Code by allowing the inter and intra-county transfer of SDD licenses.
- MICHIGAN LIQUOR CONTROL CODE AMENDMENT – BRIDGE CARD LIMITATIONS
 - (HB-5014) P.A. 197 of 2013, Effective February 1, 2014.
 - Adds MCL 436.2024 (Section 1024)
 - This law adds a new section to the Michigan Liquor Control Code requiring a licensee to work with the Department of Human Services and with automatic teller machine services to prevent an individual's ability to access bridge card cash benefits on the liquor retailer's premises.


