Schedule of Accounting Periods

This bulletin shows the schedule of the Commission's accounting periods for the fiscal years 2013 through 2015. The schedule, dated July 17, 2013, designates accounting week numbers, corresponding week ending dates, number of weekdays per month, total weekdays per fiscal year, and accounting month periods. This information will be used by the Commission for sales and inventory accounting purposes.

Week 1 of the 2013 fiscal year has a week ending date of 10-06-12 and includes 5 week days.
Week 52 of the 2013 fiscal year has a week ending date of 09-30-13 and includes 6 week days.

Week 1 of the 2014 fiscal year has a week ending date of 10-05-13 and includes 4 week days.
Week 52 of the 2014 fiscal year has a week ending date of 09-30-14 and includes 7 week days.

Week 1 of the 2015 fiscal year has a week ending date of 10-04-14 and includes 3 week days.
Week 52 of the 2015 fiscal year has a week ending date of 09-30-15 and includes 8 week days.
