- d. Soulardarity
  - Grant Request DTE IRP (U-20471) \$7,500 (AG is in this case) Issues centered around low-income residential customers, infrastructure issues, cost risks, appropriate valuing of DG, looking at stakeholder participation and actually using the planning principals.
     Q: About the business practices and the effect of DTE's business practices. Infrastructure upgrades and where dollars are being spent and which class of residential customers those upgrades benefit.
