**Maximum THC Levels for  
 Marijuana-Infused Products – Updated**

The Bureau of Marijuana Regulation (BMR) enforces the Administrative Rules under the authority of the Medical Marijuana Facilities Licensing Act (MMFLA).

Administrative Rule 62 (R 333.262) states that marijuana-infused products processed, sold, or transferred through provisioning centers must not exceed the maximum THC levels as established by the department.

For the purposes of maximum THC levels for marijuana-infused products, the department shall publish a list of maximum THC concentration and serving size limits.

These limits are listed below:

<b>Marijuana-Infused Product Examples</b>	<b>Maximum Level of Active Delta 9 THC Allowable Per Dose</b>	<b>Maximum Level of Active Delta 9 THC Allowable Per Container</b>
Gummies, baked goods, etc.	50 mg	200 mg
Capsules, tinctures, etc.	100 mg	2000 mg
Suppositories and tampons	100 mg	2000 mg
Transdermal Patches	100 mg	2000 mg
Topical products including lubricants, spa products, lotions, balms or rubs	N/A	N/A
Products not listed	10 mg	100 mg
