

# MIOSHA Temporary Worker Initiative Symposium

Wednesday, October 12, 2016 8:30 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. – Cost: Free

The use of temporary workers in the United States has grown tremendously. Workers that are identified as temporary accounted for about 1.2 million people in February 2005 - a number that more than doubled in 2013. There is a growing body of research showing that temporary workers are at greater risk of workplace injury and illness than permanent employees. MIOSHA is looking to increase awareness of safety and health concerns and issues in the temporary worker industry. This symposium is designed to provide an understanding of the staffing agency and the host employer's shared responsibilities for providing a safe work environment for temporary workers.

- ▶ Identify which employers have the responsibility for protecting temporary workers.
- ▶ Review temporary worker injury & illness case studies.
- ▶ Provide recommendations for the staffing agency and host employer in developing a shared employment structure.
- ▶ Discuss the MIOSHA multi-employer work instruction.

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

## Directions

### **From I-75 - Westbound US-10 (Bay City)**

Take I-75 Exit 162B, at US-10 West for approximately 11 miles. Merge left at Exit 128 Downtown Midland. Take first exit. Waldo Ave. Turn right on Waldo and immediately turn left on Ridgewood Drive. Great Lakes Safety is second driveway on right.

### **From US-10 (Clare)**

Eastbound US-10 to Exit 126, Waldo Avenue. (Midland). Turn right at traffic light (Waldo Avenue). Proceed approximately 2 miles. Turn left on Ridgecrest Drive. Turn right on Ridgewood Drive. Great Lakes Safety is the second driveway on left.

### **From M-20 (Mount Pleasant)**

Eastbound M-20 into downtown Midland. M-20 (East Business US-10) becomes one-way street through town. After the Bayliss St. traffic light, merge into Center lane. After the Washington St traffic light, immediately merge left and follow road straight through to East Patrick Rd. Take East Patrick for another mile. Just past the Waldo Avenue traffic light, turn left on Ridgewood Drive. Great Lakes Safety is second driveway on right.
