Equipment listed on this permit/training certification card require operator selection, training, and testing prior to issuance. Consult MIOSHA General Industry Standards Part 21. Powered Industrial Trucks, Part 58. Aerial Work Platforms; and Construction Safety Standards Part 12. Scaffolds, Part 13. Mobile Equipment, and Part 32. Aerial Work Platforms, for special requirements.

Other Moibile Equipment

MIOSHA General Industry Standards Part 19. Crawler, Locomotive and Truck Crane, Part 22. Tractors, and Construction Safety Standard Part 10. Lifting and Digging Equipment, also contain operator selection, training, and testing requirements. However, operator permits or training certification is optional.
