Background: The WIOA, which supersedes the Workforce Investment Act of 1998,
presents an extraordinary opportunity to improve job and career options
for our nation's workers and job seekers through an integrated, job-driven
public workforce system that links diverse talent to businesses.

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The WIOA supports the development of strong, vibrant regional economies where businesses thrive, and people want to live and work. This revitalized workforce system will be characterized by three critical hallmarks of excellence:

- (1) The needs of business and workers drive workforce solutions.
- (2) One-Stop centers provide excellent customer service to workers, job seekers and employers, and focus on continuous improvement.
- (3) The workforce system supports strong regional economies and plays an active role in community, economic, and workforce development.

The Michigan Department of Labor and Economic Opportunity-Workforce Development (LEO-WD) previously identified \$1,230,000 in a combination of Appropriation Year (AY) 2018 Wagner-Peyser and AY 2019 WIOA Statewide Activity funds to be used in support of programs offering dropout prevention, dropout recovery, school-to-career, and/or school-to-college programming.

Policy: This policy rescinds PI 20-20, issued July 20, 2020.

Wagner-Peyser formula funding awarded in PIs 19-19 and 20-17, WIOA Adult, Dislocated Worker, and Youth funding awarded in PIs 19-20, and subsequent changes, and 20-14, and WIOA Statewide Activities funding awarded in PI 20-15 may be used to fund allowable activities respective to each funding stream, for the operation of programs offering dropout prevention, dropout recovery, school-to-career, and/or school-to-college programming, as appropriate.
