RE: Program Year 2021-2022 AEFLA Grant Awards

The Michigan Department of Labor and Economic Opportunity, Workforce Development (LEO-WD) has established the Program Year (PY) 2021-2022 grant awards for providers of adult education services under the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA), Title II, Adult Education and Family Literacy Act (AEFLA). PY 2021-2022 is the second year of a four-year grant cycle so only providers approved for funding in PY 2020-2021 are eligible for funding.

The purpose of AEFLA is to improve the quality of life for individuals with low basic skills. Literacy and numeracy are fundamental skills necessary for workforce success, as well as for personal and social well-being. Services provided under the AEFLA are intended to lead to further education, training opportunities, and employment; and are to be based on best practices derived from the most rigorous research available. The diversity of individuals who possess low skills requires a broad approach to skills development.

As one of six core programs under the WIOA, the AEFLA program plays an integral role in the workforce development system by providing access to educational services for adult learners. The program seeks to increase opportunity in the educational and workforce development of adults as workers, parents, and citizens. While playing a critical role in adult attainment of a secondary school diploma, the program also aims to assist in the transition to post-secondary education and training through the development of career pathways.

The following table provides a listing of all AEFLA recipients approved for General Instruction (Section 231), Institutional (Section 225) and Integrated English Literacy and Civics Education (Section 243), pending State Administrative Board approval. The grant awards include the base allocation for this grant cycle and a 1.5 percent increase, matching the increase in the state award from the U.S. Department of Education.
