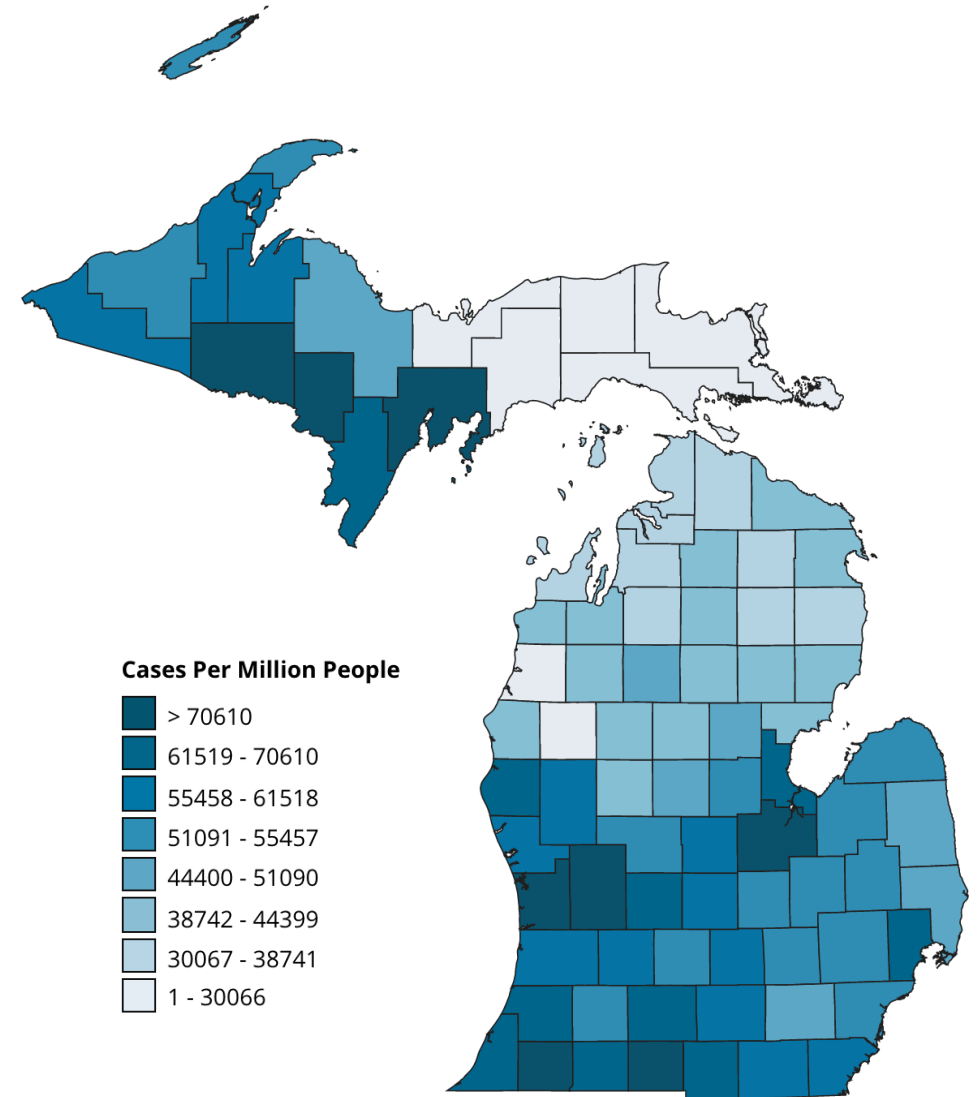
COVID-19 in Michigan

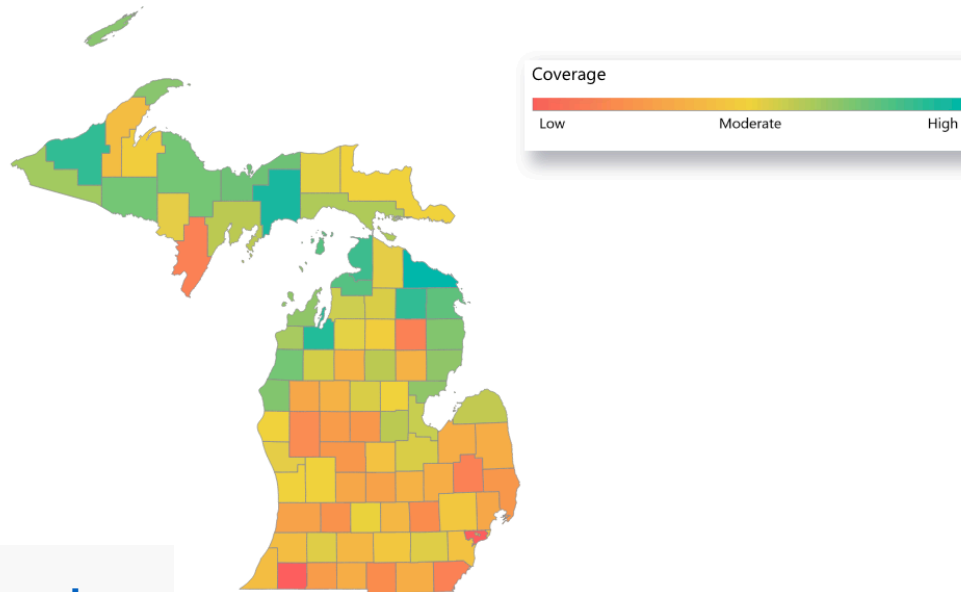
COVID-19 Vaccine Dashboard

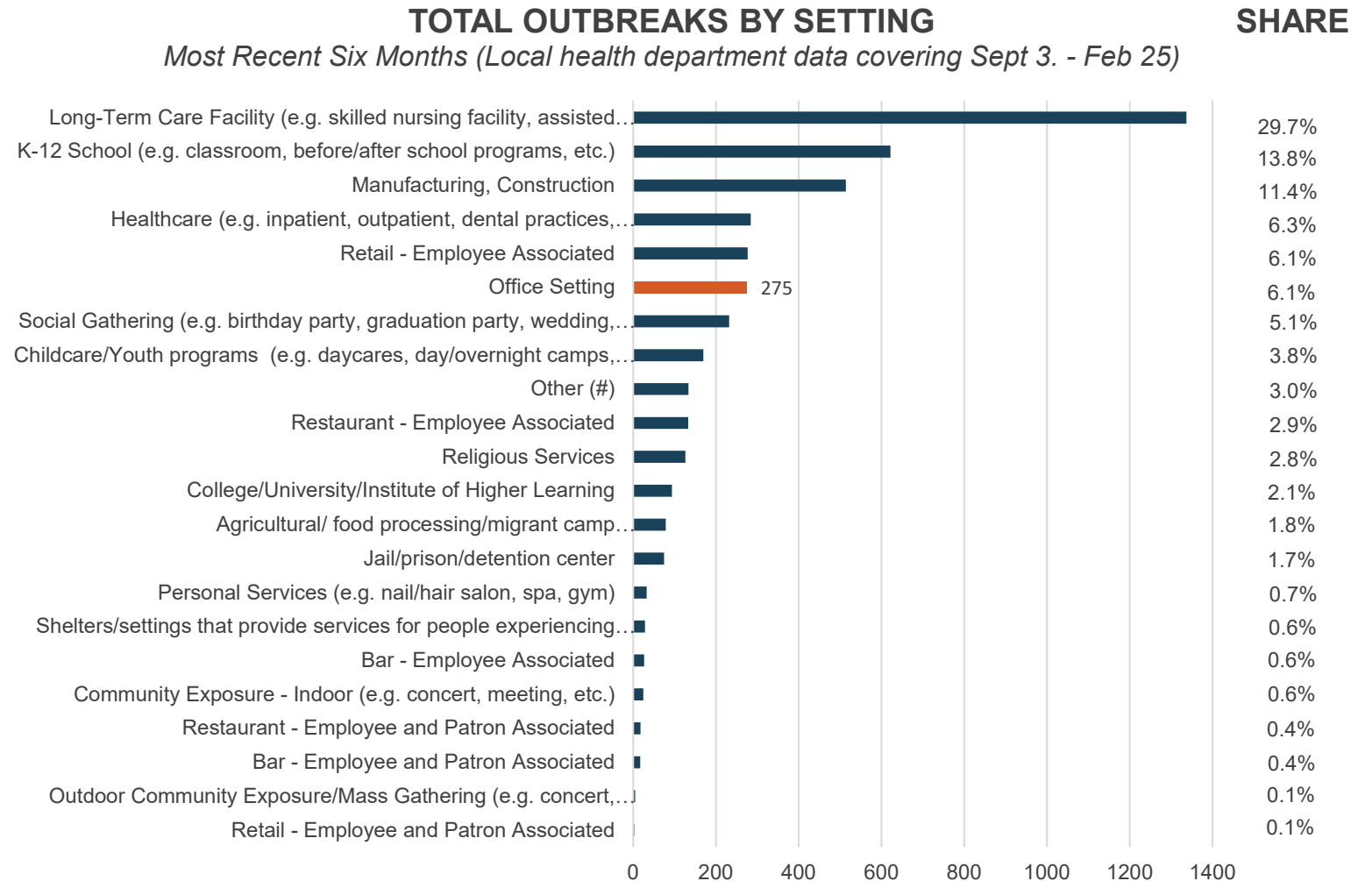

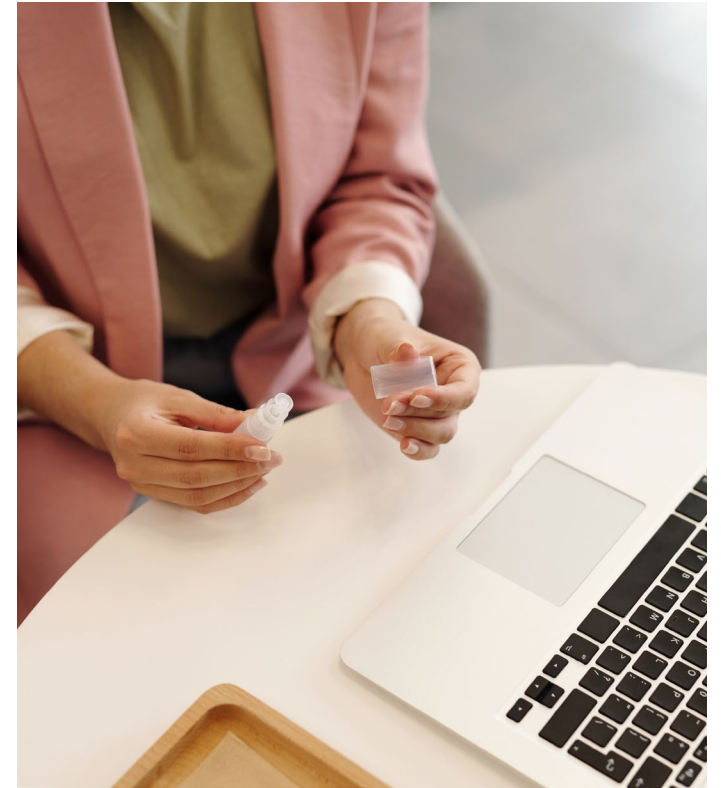

Open and Operate Safely

The State has been working with businesses to **get Michigan back to work safely**:

- Collaboration and Consultation
- Train employees on health and safety practices
- Keep customers and employees safe during reopening



MIOSHA Emergency Rules

- Extension is expected.
- Rules can accommodate a phased-in return.
- **Does not prohibit in-person work.**
- Require employers to determine whether remote work is feasible to help ensure COVID-19 transmission is mitigated to maximum extent possible.
- MIOSHA to begin formal rulemaking process for permanent COVID-19 rules. Rules can be rescinded once the pandemic has ended.



The Next Step

A new work group consisting of Business, Labor and Public Health leaders will provide recommendations on Back-to-Work policies.

- Ongoing recommendations

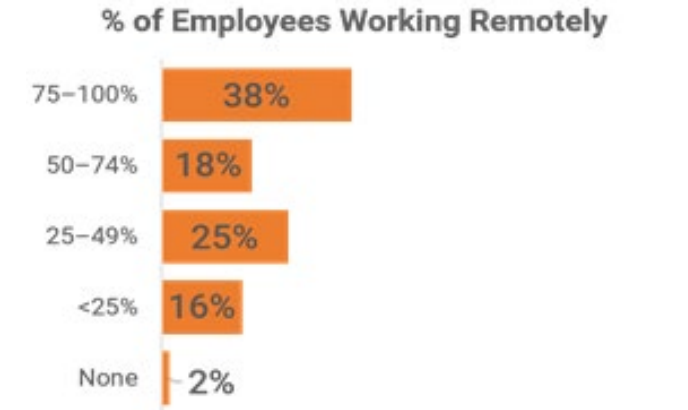
The group is expected to complete its work in 4-6 weeks.



Business Findings

A recent member survey completed by Business Leaders for Michigan provides key insights into how businesses are successfully navigating the working environment as COVID-19 remains a challenge:

- **88%** of executives predicted stable or expanded employment.
- **91%** of executives expecting steady or increasing capital investment.
- **Nearly 55%** of executives say at least half of their staff members are still working remotely.
- Most employers are not anticipating employees to return to work until Q3 this year.



Ambassador Program



Over 2,000 businesses across Michigan have participated in the MIOSHA COVID-19 Workplace Safety Ambassador Program since September 2020.
