
Purpose of Grant

Culturally Responsive Leadership in STEM Education

When schools make community connections with parents and students, they honor community-based ways of knowing.



Eligibility

- Local Education Agency or Public School Academy in Michigan
- Priority given to those aligned to school improvement plan
- Currently using a 3-P learning approach is required





Grant Consortium Members

- MiSTEM Network Region
 - Contact region staff if applying for grant
- One LEA or PSA in Michigan
 - LEA or PSA must be the lead for proposal and provide fiscal services for this grant.
- At least one noneducation community partner
 - Business, nonprofit, government agency, etc.



MiSTEM 16 Regions



Grantee Expectations

- Pre-grant, end-of-grant surveys, feedback forms, telephone interview
- Information on current 3-P instruction strategies (lessons, documents, etc.)
- Data collection

- ☐ Gathering content to create vignettes for playbook
- Examples: video, images
- ☐ Live or virtual interviews
- Permission to use requested materials

Review of Applications

Selection Step 1

Applications are reviewed based on grant selection criteria



Grant Selection Criteria

- ☐ **Relevance:** applicant history of 3-P learning in school/district
- Technical Merit: strategies feasible, technically sound, reproducible to accomplish 3-P instructional approach
- ☐ Commitment: extent that 3-P learning is institutionalized in school/district improvement plan and culture
- **Education:** agreement to share data and documents of applicant's history/progress to create vignettes for visibility on MiSTEM Playbook
- Outreach: extent to which LEA/PSA engages with external partners and community in 3-P instruction strategies



Invitation to Present

Selection Step 2

- □ Invited applicants will share their "Passionate 3-P story presentation" to the MiSTEM Review Team
- 10-minute presentation, 10-minute Q&A
- Guidelines will be provided for presentation preparation
