Background: PA 62 of 2019, Section 236 § 280 approves a portion of the Higher Education Appropriations for the funding of the KCP FFF Program, to be administered by each public university in a manner prescribed by the Michigan Department of Labor and Economic Opportunity – Workforce Development (LEO-WD).

The FFF Program provides financial support to Michigan's 15 public universities, intending to increase the pool of academically or economically disadvantaged candidates pursuing faculty teaching careers in postsecondary education. Future Faculty Fellows are eligible to pursue a master's or doctoral degree at a public university in Michigan. Preference may not be given to applicants on the basis of race, color, ethnicity, gender, or national origin. Fellowship recipients are obligated, by signed agreement, to remain in qualifying postsecondary faculty teaching or administration positions in a public or private, two- or four-year postsecondary institution for between one and three years equivalent full-time, dependent upon the total fellowship amount.

Policy: The FFF Administrative Handbook, issued October 15, 2019, prescribes the manner in which each public university shall utilize these funds to administer the FFF Program.

Attachment A, published by the House Fiscal Agency on October 15, 2019, dictates the minimum funding allocations for each KCP Initiative Program, by university. Universities may opt to expend additional funds from their appropriations.

Action: Prior to the expenditure of PA 62 FFF Program funds, the university shall fully expend remaining funds from PA 265, which expire September 30, 2020, in accordance with PI 19-15.

FFF Program funds shall be expended in accordance with the FFF Administrative Handbook. Funds not expended or encumbered by the funding expiration date will revert to the State General Fund. Unexpended funds shall be returned to WD by December 9, 2020.
