Fidelity Bonding





The Fidelity Bonding Program of Michigan is an incentive for employers to hire jobseekers who are qualified, but who are considered high-risk because of a factor in their personal background. A Fidelity Bond is a business insurance policy of Chubb Ltd. that insures an employer against losses due to employee theft, forgery, larceny and embezzlement.

Why use Fidelity Bonding?

Fidelity Bonding helps high-risk job seekers obtain employment. Fidelity Bonding offers an incentive for employers to hire jobseekers who are qualified, but who are considered high-risk because of their personal background.

Fidelity Bonding Features

- · Easy application process
- Free bonding for the first six months of employment
- · No deductible
- Bonds available in the amounts of \$5,000 \$25,000
- Extended coverage available directly from Chubb Ltd.

Who is eligible for Fidelity Bonding?

- · People with poor credit records including bankruptcies
- · Economically disadvantaged youth and adults who lack a work history
- Welfare assistance recipients
- · Recovering substance abusers including opioid users
- · Justice-involved citizens
- · Those dishonorably discharged from military service
- Youth in apprenticeships (age 18+)
- · Those who cannot be commercially bonded
- Temporary Assistance for Needy Families recipients
- · Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed individuals



What are the benefits of Fidelity Bonding?

The Fidelity Bonding program allows employers to obtain workers without taking a risk and allows high-risk jobseekers to find work.

The program diminishes the risk for employers and reduces the barriers to employment faced by jobseekers.

What is the application process?

- Either the employer or the jobseeker may request the bond.
- Bonding assistance is available through local Michigan Works!
 Agency (MWA) Service Centers.
- The employer must complete a phone intake with the MWA Fidelity Bonding Coordinator after an offer of employment is accepted by the jobseeker to be bonded.
