2 MIOSHA Training Institute

The certificate program offers participants an opportunity to be recognized for their educational efforts and increased technical expertise. Courses are offered throughout the state in sponsorship with other M-TECSM facilities, community colleges, and safety and health organizations. It is highly recommended that students complete "Recommended Practices for Safety and Health Programs" before taking this course.
