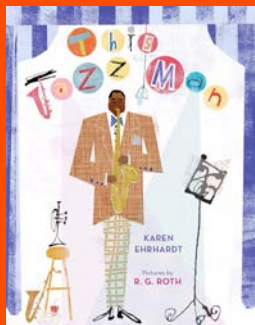


BRAILLE ENHANCED STORYWALK® IN MICHIGAN



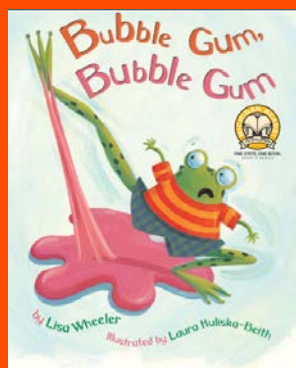
32 Michigan libraries created a StoryWalk® for their community with support from partner organizations.

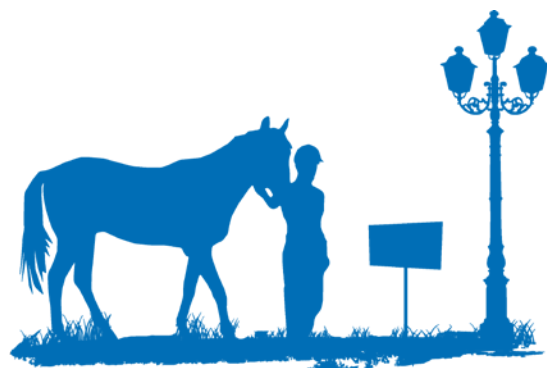
34% of libraries chose the most popular story, *Never Play Music Right Next to the Zoo.*
