WHEREAS, Kate McAuliffe has worked tirelessly to change the educational laws and policies of Michigan to benefit all of Michigan's children; and

WHEREAS, Kate McAuliffe has informed the State Board of Education of her retirement from the Michigan Department of Education as of March 31, 2003; now, therefore be it
